

ONIONS GOOD CROP FOR SMALL GROWER.

Speaking of golden opportunities practically neglected by the ranchers of southern Idaho, S. G. Smith of the Canyon Commission company, eloquent over the onion. He said:

The growing of onions for seed has become one of the recognized crops in some parts of this valley and from reports of the growers engaged in this business, it may be carried on very successfully, speaking of the venture both financially and as to grade of seed.

A great many have not realized that the growing of onions for marketing in car lots may be a really better proposition for the farmer than that of growing for seed. Average prices at harvest time running from one dollar per cwt and up. Onions and cabbage take a very little higher rate, when shipped in car lots, than potatoes, and may be shipped in mixed cars to great advantage, one a number of markets.

During the season just passed we have shipped onions to eastern markets where they have given the best satisfaction in every case bringing requests for more of the same stock. We have also had many letters from different points in the southern territory, asking for quotations, but on account of the limited amount grown here were unable to furnish them.

Onions thrive best on a rich loamy soil, and unlike most vegetables, succeed well when cultivated on the same ground for successive years. The ground should be well manured in the fall and thrown up in ridges to soften during the winter. As early in the spring as the ground is in working order, harrow down to a fine seed bed and plant the seed in rows about 15 inches apart, covering very light, just enough to avoid drying out. When the young plants are strong enough thin gradually to about four inches. The ground should be kept loose by careful cultivation—taking care not to cover the bulb. When ripe the onions should be thoroughly dry before sacking or storing.

There are several varieties of onions that will do well in this country and also find ready sale in other markets, the more popular being the Red Wetherfield, Yellow Globe Danvers, and the White Silver Skin, the latter will probably not yield as heavy per acre as the former varieties but will on some markets bring a higher price. To the man with a small acreage especially, we would say "do not overlook the onion"—it means a good income from a limited amount of ground.

The meeting was marked by enthusiasm and the best results are anticipated.
