PROCEEDINGS OF THE COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

Nineteenth Day of July Term, 1922 Caldwell, Idaho, September 30, 1922

The board of county commissioners met pursuant to a recess taken on the 11th inst. Present: Otto G. Reinhardt, Frank M. Brown, D. J. Westcott, Chairman, Commissioners, Rose Edwards, Clerk. The bills for salaries of officials, deputies and clerks, mothers' pensions and pension of blind were viewed and allowed and the auditor is ordered to draw current expense warrants to cover claim numbers 2201 to 2203 both inclusive. Whereupon, The Board of County Commissioners recessed until the 5th of October, 1922. Approved: D. J. WESTCOTT, Chairman. ROSE EDWARDS, Clerk.

The board of county commissioners proceeded to canvass the bills against the county and same were allowed as follows: CURRENT EXPENSE All claims from numbers 2102 to 2390 inclusive except numbers 2201 to 2303 which were allowed on the 30th of September, and except numbers 2309 for \$235.00, Anna S. Steensland, disallowed, and 2310 for \$153.00, Anna S. Steensland, disallowed. ROAD AND BRIDGE All claims from numbers 2102 to 2280 except number 2199 for \$50.00, disallowed double on number 2195. CANYON HILL BRIDGE Claim numbers 31 to 38 inclusive. It is hereby ordered by the board of county commissioners that the tax on the following accounts of the 1921 personal assessment roll be cancelled. This tax is on state land on which the sale certificate has been cancelled by the state board of land commissioners. Acct. 373, L. J. Hazen \$ 60 Acct. 891, Helen Usadel 6.00 Acct. 858, Ione Taylor 25 Acct. 465, Dewey L. Kent 24 Order from the Probate Court for Mothers' Allowance or pension for Mrs. Maude Novella Trotter, of Caldwell, Idaho, was presented to the board of county commissioners which order was approved and the county auditor directed to place her name on the list for regular monthly payments of \$20.00. Mrs. Sarah Goodwin, Nampa, Idaho, Route No. 5, files a bond for lost warrant, which is found regular in every respect by the commissioners and the auditor is ordered to issue a duplicate warrant on the current expense fund number 1695 of 1922 issue dated Sept. 1, 1922, in the amount of \$10.00 to Mrs. Sarah Goodwin, and notify treasurer of said duplicate issue. The report of W. E. Kerrick as justice of the peace of Parma precinct for the quarter ending September 30, 1922, is hereby approved and filed. The board of county commissioners hereby ordered the auditor and treasurer to transfer the sum of \$2318.52 from special roads to general road and bridge fund. The board of county commissioners hereby ordered the auditor and treasurer to transfer \$11,427.67 from warrant redemption fund to general road and bridge fund. The board of county commissioners hereby order the auditor and treasurer to transfer \$90.39 from the current expense fund to institute fund. Whereupon the commissioners recessed until the 6th inst. Twenty-first Day of the July Term, 1922

Caldwell, Idaho, October 6, 1922

The board of county commissioners met pursuant to recess taken on the 5th inst. Present: Otto G. Reinhardt, D. J. Westcott, chairman, commissioners, Rose Edwards, Clerk. The board of county commissioners of Canyon county, Idaho, met pursuant to adjournment from August 29, 1922, at its office in the court house in Caldwell, Canyon county, Idaho, the county seat of said county, to Friday, this 6th day of October, 1922, at 10 o'clock a. m. for the purpose of hearing the petition of George Franklin et al for the organization of an irrigation district by which it is proposed to purchase a canal system commonly known as the Griffiths Golden Gate Irrigation Ditch, and that the lands proposed to be included in the said irrigation district are in the Golden Gate and Devers additions to the city of Caldwell, Idaho. And the petition coming on regularly for hearing, Cleve Groome appearing as counsel on behalf of said petitioners, whereupon witnesses were sworn and testified on behalf of the said petitioners. And it appearing to the board that there had been due publication of the notice that George Franklin et al had filed a petition for the organization of an irrigation district, which said notice stated that it was proposed to purchase a canal system generally known as the Griffiths Golden Gate Irrigation Ditch and further stated the time at which such petition would be presented to the board of county commissioners, which said notice was duly published two weeks prior to the date when said petition was presented to the said board of county commissioners of Canyon county, Idaho. And it further appearing that upon presentation of said petition the board of county commissioners set a time for a hearing upon the same which was not less than for nor more than eight weeks from the date of presentation and caused notice of the time of such hearing to be published at least three weeks before the time of such hearing in The Caldwell Tribune, a newspa-

per published within the county in which said district is situate.

And it further appearing that a report has been submitted on said matter by the commissioner of reclamation of the state of Idaho approving the organization of said proposed district, which said report and recommendation is on file with the clerk of the board of county commissioners of Canyon county, Idaho.

And it further appearing that at the time of the filing of such petition the petitioners accompanied the same with a map of said proposed district showing the location of the canal or ditch proposed to be purchased and all canals situate within the boundaries of the said proposed district, also with a bond in the penal sum of Two Hundred Dollars (\$200.00), being double the amount of the probable cost to the county of organizing such district, conditioned that the bondsman would not be held liable in case said organization be not effected, which said bond has been duly approved by the board of county commissioners, and also an estimate of the cost of such works to the district certified to by Fred H. McConnel, a well known and competent irrigation engineer.

Whereupon, the board having duly considered the matter, proceeded to hear the said petition. Evidence was produced on behalf of the petitioners by their witnesses and from the consideration of which the board finds that the petition was signed by the requisite number of holders of title or evidence of title to land within the boundaries of the said proposed district and that said holders of title or evidence of title actually hold the title to more than a quarter of the total area of the lands within the boundaries of the proposed district which will be assessable for the purposes of the district; that a copy of such petition and all maps and other papers filed with the petition were filed in the office of the commissioner of reclamation of the state of Idaho, as is required by law.

Beginning at a point where the north boundary line of the right of way of the Riverside canal intercepts the north and south boundary line of Sections 21 and 22, T. 4 N., R. 3 W.; thence north along the north and south boundary line between Sections 21 and 22 and Sections 16 and 15 of the said township and range to the point where the said boundary line intercepts the southerly bank of the Boise river; thence running southerly along the southerly bank of the Boise river to the point where the said southerly bank of the Boise river intercepts the north and south line of said Sections 16 and 21 of said T. 4 N., R. 3 W., B. M.; thence south on the said north and south half section line to the southwest corner of the southwest quarter (SW 1-4) of the northeast quarter (NE 1-4) of said Section 21, T. 4 N., R. 3 W., of Boise Meridian; thence east to the point where the south boundary line of the northwest quarter (NW 1-4) of the northwest quarter (NW 1-4) of said Section 22, T. 4 N., R. 3 W., of B. M. intercepts the westerly boundary line of the right of way of the Boise and Interurban Railway; thence in a north and easterly direction along the westerly boundary of said Boise and Interurban Railway to the point where the said boundary line intercepts the center line of Freepport Street of Caldwell, Canyon county, Idaho, extended; thence northwesterly along the said center line of Freepport street extended to where the said center line of Freepport street intercepts the westerly boundary line of the Riverside canal; thence in a southwesterly direction along the westerly boundary line of said Riverside canal to the point of beginning.

A vote being requested on said order resulted as follows: Ayes: D. J. Westcott, Otto G. Reinhardt. Absent: Frank M. Brown.

It having been made to appear to the board from the evi-

dence adduced that a clerical error had occurred in drafting the petition for the organization of the said district whereby the word "west" was used in the last work of the first line of the description of the land proposed to be included within the boundaries of the said district, whereas the word "east" should have been used.

Now, Therefore, Be It Ordered that the petition may be amended by interlineation to read as follows: "Beginning at a point 660 feet west of the east quarter corner of Sec. 22, T. 4 N., R. W., Boise Meridian," following the remainder of the description as given in the petition.

Whereupon, It Is Ordered that the boundaries of the proposed irrigation district and the lands included in the same be and the same are hereby described as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a point 660 feet west of the east quarter corner of Section 22, Township 4 North, Range 3 West of Boise Meridian; thence north 2640 feet; thence west 660 feet; thence north to the northeasterly side of Block 84 and 85 of the Golden Gate Addition to Caldwell, Canyon County, Idaho; thence north-easterly along the northeasterly side of Block 85, 84, 83 and 82 of the Golden Gate Addition to Caldwell, Canyon county, Idaho, to the east and west half section line in Section 15, Township 4 North, Range 3 West of Boise Meridian; thence west to the Boise river; thence southwesterly along the southeasterly bank of the said Boise river to the point where the north and south boundary lines between Sections 15 and 16, T. 4 N., R. 3 W. of B. M. intercepts the south bank of the Boise river; thence south along the north and south boundary line between said Sections 15 and 16 and Sections 21 and 22 of the same township and range where the said line intercepts the northwesterly boundary line of the right of way of the Riverside Canal; thence in a north-easterly direction along the northwesterly line of the right of way of the Riverside canal to the point where the center line of Freepport street, Caldwell, Canyon county, Idaho, extended intercepts the northwesterly boundary line of the right of way of the Riverside canal; thence in a south-easterly direction along the center line of said Freepport street extended to the point where the said center line of said Freepport street extended intercepts the northwesterly boundary line of the right of way of the Boise and Interurban Railway; thence in a southwesterly direction along the northwesterly boundary line of the Boise and Interurban Railway right of way to the point where the said northwesterly boundary line of the Boise and Interurban Railway right of way intercepts the south boundary line of the northwest quarter (NW 1-4) of the northwest quarter (NW 1-4) of Section 22, T. 4 N., R. 3 W. of Boise Meridian; thence west along the south boundary line of the said northwest quarter (NW 1-4) of the northwest quarter (NW 1-4) of said Section 22 and the northeast quarter (NE 1-4) of the northeast quarter (NE 1-4) of said Section 21 to the point where the said boundary line intercepts the northeasterly boundary line of the right of way of the Oregon Short Line Railroad; thence south-easterly along the said right of way to its intersection with the center line of Fourth Avenue in said City of Caldwell; thence north-easterly along the center line of Fourth Avenue to the center line of Albany Street; thence south-easterly along the center line of Albany street to the center line of Fifth Avenue; thence north-easterly along the center line of Belmont street; thence south-easterly along the center line of Belmont street to the center line of Sixth Avenue; thence north-easterly along the center line of Sixth avenue to the center line of Denver street; thence south-easterly along the center line of Denver street to the center line of Seventh avenue; thence south-easterly along the center line of Seventh avenue to the center line of Elgin street; thence south-easterly along the center line of Elgin street to the center line of Eighth or Kimball avenue; thence north-easterly along the center line of Eighth avenue to the center line of Freepport street; thence south-easterly along the center line of Freepport street to the center line of Ninth avenue; thence north-easterly along the center line of Ninth avenue to the center line of Galveston street; thence south-easterly along the center line of Galveston street to the east and west half section line in Section 22, T. 4 N., R. 3 W. of Boise Meridian; thence east 660 feet to the place of beginning.

All of the above described lands be-

ing susceptible to one mode of irrigation from a common source and by the same system of works, the same will be organized into an irrigation district after the vote of the irrigators hereafter to be taken on the proposition shall be favorable to such organization.

Whereupon, It Is Ordered That the said proposed district be divided into three (3) divisions, to be known as Division No. 1, Division No. 2 and Division No. 3, the same being as nearly equal in size as is practicable to-wit:

Division No. 1 shall consist of all that portion of said proposed district lying southwest of the center line of Freepport street of Caldwell, Canyon county, Idaho;

Division No. 2 shall consist of all that portion lying southeast of the center line of Third avenue and north-east of the center line of Freepport street of Caldwell, Canyon county, Idaho;

Division No. 3 shall consist of all that portion of said proposed district lying northwest of the center line of Third avenue and northeast of the center line of Freepport street of Caldwell, Canyon county, Idaho.

A vote being requested on the said order resulted as follows: Ayes: D. J. Westcott, Otto G. Reinhardt. Absent: Frank M. Brown.

It is further ordered that an election will be held in said district on Wednesday, November 22, 1922, for the purpose of determining whether or not the same shall be organized into an irrigation district under the provisions of the law and that at such election the electors shall be required to cast a ballot which shall contain the words "Irrigation District, Yes," or "Irrigation District, No," or words equivalent thereto, and also at said election there shall be elected one person from each division of said irrigation district for directors of said district. Said district shall be divided into three (3) election precincts for such election and such election precincts shall be the same as the divisions, to-wit:

Division No. 1 at the residence of Thomas Cochrane, 302 Elgin Street, Caldwell, Idaho.

Division No. 2 at the residence of A. J. Mayfield, 903 Hannibal Street, Caldwell, Idaho.

Division No. 3 at the residence of A. R. Colvard, Block 102, Golden Gate Addition, Caldwell, Idaho.

and the polls shall be open from one o'clock p. m. until seven o'clock p. m., Mountain time.

And it is further ordered that notice of such election shall be given by publication in the Caldwell Tribune a newspaper printed and published in Caldwell, Canyon county, Idaho, the same being the county in which the whole of said proposed district is situated for at least four weeks prior to such election, such notice shall describe the lands in said district with the certainty required in an ordinary deed and shall state the name of the proposed district and shall also state that a map showing the lands in said district is on file in the office of the board of county commissioners of Canyon county, Idaho, and shall require the electors to cast ballots containing the words "Irrigation District, Yes," or "Irrigation District, No," or words equivalent thereto, and also the name of one person from each division of said district for director of said district. Said notice shall also state the time and place of said election as herein ordered and that the polls will be open from one o'clock p. m. until seven o'clock p. m. and shall define the division of said district as the same is herein described and the chairman of this board and the clerk or his deputy shall give such notice.
