RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, It is proposed to improve that section of the public highway lying between the city limits of Caldwell, Canyon county Idaho, and the boundary of the Nampa highway

district on what is commonly called the Nampa-Caldwell Boulevard; and WHEREAS, It is advisable and expedient to enter into a contract with the Nampa highway district for the improvement of said highway; Therefore, Be It Resolved, That a contract be entered into by and between Canyon county, Idaho, and the Nampa highway district, for the construction and improvement of said highway, which said contract shall be in words and figures as follows: COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT Highway Construction Canyon County With Nampa Highway District

THIS AGREEMENT, made this 8th day of November, 1922, by and between the County of Canyon, State of Idaho, acting through its board of county commissioners, party of the first part, and Nampa Highway District, Canyon county, Idaho, acting through its board of highway district commissioners, the party of the second part:

WITNESSETH, Whereas, the party of the first part has entered into a cooperative agreement with the Department of Public Works of the state of Idaho, for the construction or improvement of that certain section of designated state highway within said Canyon county lying between the city limits of Caldwell, Idaho, and the west boundary line of the Nampa highway district, and commonly called the Nampa-Caldwell Boulevard, and comprising approximately eight-tenths (8-10) of a mile of highway, and

WHEREAS, The party of the second part is now engaged in the construction or improvement of the section of said designated state highway lying within the boundaries of said Nampa highway district under a cooperative agreement with said department of public works, and has the necessary machinery and equipment available for the handling of said work at the minimum costs, and

WHEREAS, It is of mutual benefit to the parties hereto to have said first above mentioned section of said state highway constructed or improved as a connecting link of the whole, and the first party finds it advantageous and expedient to have said work done by said second party and said second party finds it advantageous and expedient to do said work, and it being deemed for the best interests of both; now, therefore,

For and in consideration of the premises and the several promises of each, to be faithfully performed, as hereinafter specified and set forth, the parties hereto hereby mutually agree as follows, to-wit:

The party of the second part promises and agrees to do and perform as expeditiously as possible all work necessary in the construction or improvement of said first above mentioned section of designated state highway, and to furnish all men and equipment therefor, and to do and perform said work under the direct supervision and direction of commissioner of public works of Idaho or his duly authorized representative, and to do said work at actual cost plus amount of depreciation on equipment to be figured on the same basis as like work done by said second party within its district.

The party of the first part promises and agrees to pay said second party for said work, upon completion thereof, the actual costs thereof plus the amount of depreciation on equipment as above stated, estimated at the sum of \$6,000.00, and for that purpose said board of county commissioners and said second party have appropriated and set aside the sum of \$6,000.00 as evidenced by certified copy of resolutions hereto attached and made a part hereof.

All materials necessary for said construction, save and except dirt for grade, shall be furnished by said second party as cost and shall be included and figured as part of the actual cost of said work to be paid for by first party.

All dirt for grade shall be provided and furnished by said first party at its own expense, as well as all rights of way necessary for the hauling, obtaining and use thereof, and for the drainage of said section of highway.

Said work and construction shall be done in conjunction with the work and construction done by said second party in its district and shall be settled and paid for on statement computed, and certified to by the secretary of said second party, from the official books of accounts of said second party, on the basis of the actual cost and expense incidental to said work and construction on said section of highway within said Canyon county.

The party of the second part will comply with the requirements of Chapter 217 of 1921 Session Laws of Idaho relative to workmen's compensation act.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties have hereto caused their signatures and official seals to be affixed to the party of the first part on the day and year first above written and the party of the second part on the 8th day of November, 1922.

Caldwell, Idaho, Friday, December 1, 1922

The Board of County Commissioners, Canyon County, Idaho, met pursuant to call at the office of the Board of County Commissioners at eleven o'clock a. m.

Present: D. J. Westcott, Chairman, Otto G. Reinhardt, Rose Edwards, Clerk. Absent: Brown.

Thereupon the Board proceeded to canvass the returns of the special election held November 22, 1922, the purpose of voting on the question of the organization of the Golden Gate Irrigation District. The abstract of the vote: Polled "Irrigation District, 'Yes,' 62 votes; "Irrigation District, 'No,' 1 vote.

The number of votes cast by officers of the Golden Gate Irrigation District was as follows, to-wit: Division No. 1, M. J. Devers, 35 votes; "No," 1 vote.

Division No. 2, F. E. Bollman, 47 votes; Division No. 2, E. Anderson, 47 votes.

Thereupon the following order was made: On this the first day of December, 1922, came on regularly to be canvassed the returns of the special election heretofore ordered to be held on Wednesday, November 22, 1922, for the purpose of the organization of the Golden Gate Irrigation District and the election of officers thereof. From the canvass it appears that two-thirds of all the voters returned to the auditor of the "Irrigation District, 'Yes,' it is hereby ordered that the territory heretofore designated by an order of the Board made and dated the 15th day of October, 1922, be and the same is hereby organized as an irrigation district under the name and style of the Golden Gate Irrigation District and the officers of the said district are declared to be as follows, to-wit: Beginning at a point 660 feet west of the corner of Section 22, Township 4 North, Range 4 West of Boise Meridian; thence north 260 feet; thence west 660 feet; thence north to the northern boundary line of Block 85 and of the Golden Gate Addition to Caldwell, Canyon County, Idaho; thence northwesterly along the northwesterly boundary line of Township 4 North, Range 4 West of Boise Meridian; thence west the Boise River; thence southwesterly along the southeasterly bank of the said Boise River to the pole where the north and south boundary lines between Sections 15 and 16, T. 4 N., R. 3 W., of B. M. intersects the south bank of the Boise River; thence north along the north and south boundary lines between Sections 15 and 16 and Sections 21 and 22 the same township and range where the said line intersects the northwesterly boundary line of the right of way of the Riverside Canal; thence in a north-south direction along the northwesterly line of the right of way of the Riverside Canal to the point where the center line of Freepport Street, Caldwell, Canyon County, Idaho, extended intercepts the northwesterly boundary line of the right of way of the Riverside Canal; thence in a southeasterly direction along the center line of Freepport Street, Caldwell, Canyon County, Idaho, extended to the point where said center line of Freepport Street extended intercepts the southeasterly boundary line of the right of way of Boise & Interurban Railway; thence in a southeasterly direction along the northwesterly boundary line of the right of way of Boise & Interurban Railway right of way to the point where the said northwesterly boundary line of Boise & Interurban Railway right of way intersects the northwesterly boundary line of the northwest quarter (NW 1/4) of Section 22, T. 4 N., R. 3 W. of Boise Meridian; thence north along the northwesterly boundary line of the said northwest quarter (NW 1/4) of said Section 22 and the northwesterly boundary line of the northeast quarter (NE 1/4) of said Section 21 to the point where the said boundary line intersects the northwesterly boundary line of the right of way of the Oregon Short Line Railroad; thence southeasterly along the said right of way to its intersection with the center line of Fourth Avenue in said City of Caldwell; thence northwesterly along the center line of Fourth Avenue to the center line of Alhambra Street; thence southeasterly along the center line of Alhambra Street to the center line of Fifth Avenue; thence northwesterly along the center line of Belmont Street; thence southeasterly along the center line of Belmont Street to the center line of Sixth Avenue; thence northwesterly along the center line of Sixth Avenue to the center line of Denver Street; thence southeasterly along the center line of Denver Street to the center line of Seventh Avenue; thence northwesterly along the center line of Seventh Avenue to the center line of Eighth or Kimball Avenue; thence northwesterly along the center line of Eighth Avenue to the center line of Freepport Street; thence southeasterly

along the center line of Freepport Street to the center line of Ninth Avenue to the center line of Galveston Street; thence southeasterly along the center line of Galveston Street to the east and west half section line in Section 22, T. 4 N., R. 3 W. of Boise Meridian; thence east 660 feet to the place of beginning.

And it is further ordered that the divisions of the said district be described as follows, to-wit: Division No. 1 shall consist of all that portion of said proposed district lying southwest of the center line of Freepport Street of Caldwell, Canyon County, Idaho; Division No. 2 shall consist of all that portion of said proposed district lying southeast of the center line of Third Avenue and northeast of the center line of Freepport Street of Caldwell, Canyon County, Idaho; and

Division No. 3 shall consist of all that portion of said proposed district lying northwest of the center line of Third Avenue and northeast of the center line of Freepport Street of Caldwell, Canyon County, Idaho.

And it is further declared that the following persons received the respective number of votes for the respective offices named and are therefore declared to be elected to the same: M. J. Devers, Director of Division No. 1. F. E. Bollman, Director of Division No. 2. E. Anderson, Director of Division No. 2.

It is therefore ordered that a certified copy of the order organizing the said Golden Gate Irrigation District be filed and recorded in the office of the Recorder of Canyon County, Idaho.
