IDAHO FARMING FACES NEW ERA BARBER THINKS

Realizing the necessity for the exercise of rigid economy, I have asked for but a slight increase in this appropriation but I feel that the legislature might, with all propriety and in the exercise of real economy, make a material increase in the office expense item. The general expense appropriation determines the service to be rendered. The department has been hampered at every turn by lack of funds, it has not been able to provide needed literature, to do the needed advertising, to cover the state to encourage and secure cooperation, nor to establish personal contact in the sections to which we must look for new settlers. The most important immigration work cannot be done from the narrow confines of an office room. Nothing will take the place of personal contact or personal knowledge of conditions existing in localities where our inquiries originate. Any appropriation is too small which will not make possible the establishment of such contacts and the obtaining of such knowledge. Idaho needs new blood and has as much to offer dairymen, seed growers or other producers as any other section of the Northwest. If she secures her part of these she must be prepared to compete with other sections in interesting them.

Expenditure Classified

Disbursements of the office expense fund for the biennium, roughly classified, are as follows:

"There will remain at the close of the biennium a balance, in all funds, aggregating \$46.41."

Limits Activities

"The appropriation for this department for the biennium of 1921-1922 was \$13,805. Of this amount the office expense fund, which includes printing, advertising, travel expense, supplies, equipment and all other items than salary and clerk hire, was \$3,935. This appropriation is very small for the work that is to be done.
