

Some times however it is done purposely by rival business houses who tear down occasionally one another's signs and their own instead seemingly with out compunction or without regard to the smallness of the act showing their littleness and pique in a way that cannot but help reset upon themselves. If there is no legal way of protecting these signs there ought to be a recognized code of honor in regard to them so long as this is regarded as legitimate advertising. Any one caught destroying them ought to have "Shame! Shame!" cried in his ears until he feels his humiliation as deeply as he would if he were caught and punished for destroying any other

kind of property. We hope that such things will cease in this community and that these signs will be considered as the property of another subject to the same laws and condition as other property.
