**Council Proceedings**  
 The council met Wednesday evening July 1st with full board present. Minutes of previous meeting read and approved and the following bills read referred to the finance committee, acted upon favorably and warrants ordered drawn as: Chas. Weber, 58.75; P. R. Osborn, 25.50; J. M. Hill, 17.50; C. F. Cole, 6.35; S. A. Bechtol, 4.00; H. B. Osborn, 50c; D. B. Mackintosh, 5.00; M. C. McGrew, 1.65; Hunter & Von Soehnen, 2.50; Henry Durbin, 41.35; H. P. Hull, 1.65; Alfred Crow, 3.00.  
 The report of street and alley committee relative to sidewalks was accepted and the walks specified were condemned. A report of which is elsewhere published. The report of the same committee recommending that the water in the pond back of McCrea's and Crew's residences be drained by a box ditch was carried by a majority of one, a remonstrance relative to the action of the same committee at the pond on lower main, was read discussed and filed, and the proposition of A. P. Hamley to put a flood gate in the said pond was referred to the committee for action.

On motion ordinance No. 81. (published in another column) was read by a suspension of the rules, and unanimously passed.

The clerk was instructed to hunt up the records and ascertain if the town does not possess title to the road to the cemetery.

On motion the finance committee was ordered to draw up an ordinance repealing certain sections of No. 79. Council adjourned to July 15th 1903.
