## Died

Word reached here this morning of the passing away of Dow Ward last night at 12 o'clock at the hospital in Moscow. No hopes had been entertained of his recovery since the last attack of paralysis, and it was simply a watching of the life ebbing away. Ben Ward of Leland was telephoned and went up to help his mother in the arrangements. Mr. Simpson of Moscow, Chancellor Commander of the Knights of Pythias telephoned to this lodge, of which Mr. Ward was a member, for instructions as to what could be done. After consultation here with the Odd Fellows, and with Mrs. Ward a casket was sent up, with T. A. Hunter in charge and the body will be brought down here this afternoon, taken to Leland and the services probably held tomorrow, although nothing definite can be said till Mrs. Ward can be seen.

Dow Ward was an old timer here, well known and with many friends and we hope to give a short sketch of his life in the next issue.

To a great extent Mr. Ward's demise has been expected for a month past, in a slight way preparing his relatives and friends for this shock.

LATER—It is learned, authoritatively, that these funeral services will be held Sunday at 10 a. m. and burial will be at the Cameron cemetery.

Mrs. Frank Normoyle died last Sunday at Stites. She has been sick for some time with consumption and had gone to Stites for the benefit of her health but to no purpose. It will be remembered that Mr. Normoyle died a little over a year ago in Butte Mont. after a few days illness with appendicitis and since that time Mrs. Normoyle has declined in health steadily. Her remains were taken to her old home in Palouse Monday and were buried Tuesday. She leaves three children one of them being only a few months old. They will be cared for by the grandparents. Mrs. Normoyle was a daughter-in-law of M. C. Normoyle formerly of Kendrick now of Coeur d'Alene city and a cousin by marriage of Mesdames D. S. and W. M. McCrea of this place. She was a woman of lovely character and will be sorely missed by her orphaned children and many friends.

## Fourth at Gold Hill

The Fourth of July celebration at Gold Hill was a very successful affair considering the state of the weather on that day. Notwithstanding the gloominess there were about 700 people present a gathering composed of the inhabitants not only of the Gold Hill community but many from the surrounding ridges. A number were in attendance from Kendrick also.

There were a number of speakers for the occasion among them being Congressman Barton L. French whose home is near there, Morton Jenks and James Konitz. The speech of Mr. French is said to have been a very brilliant one and was roundly applauded at various points of the address. There were recitations and songs by local talent in the forenoon. At the time the after dinner sports were announced it commenced raining and they had to be given up. The Ball at night was a great success about 20 couples participating, the music being furnished by H. A. Sanatu and wife. Mesdames Frye, Founberry, Thornton and Fee served meals throughout the day which were excellent in every respect and were greatly appreciated by the hungry crowd.

Miss Gladys Langdon acted as Goddess of Liberty and was elaborately dressed, her part on the program being most gracefully performed. The proceeds of the occasion which amounted to about \$200 will be applied on the debt incurred in building the fine new Gold Hill schoolhouse. After all expenses have been paid there will be about \$100. for this purpose.

Taking it all in all the celebration was a great success and reflected considerable credit on those who had its management in charge.

## Leland Celebration

The Leland celebration on the fourth was a splendid occasion. A goodly crowd was in attendance, gathering from all parts; Kendrick, Juliaetta, Troy, Lewiston, Cavendish, and other points. The sports were somewhat interfered with on account of the rain as in other sections and points, but just the same the weather did not interfere with the good time. The program in the morning was fine, Geo. Tannahill of Lewiston was the orator of the day and he delivered a splendid address. The dance in the fine new Odd Fellow's hall was all that could be desired. In fact every one present enjoyed themselves and the day, so it can be truly said that Leland celebrated in a satisfactory manner.
