It Explains Itself

Lewiston, Idaho, July 15, 03.
Deputy Sheriff, Harve Foreman, on Sunday, July 12, arrested two young men of Lewiston Idaho for killing grouse out of season.

The principal in the affair was Lou's Grostein, a son of the wealthy retired merchant, Robt. Grostein, and his companion a Mr. Held, a late arrival in the state.

The authorities had been informed that some one had, for the past six weeks been shooting grouse on Hatwi creek five miles from Lewiston. A close watch was kept on those going fishing on that stream with the result that the two young men were found with the grouse carefully packed in their fish baskets with a few small trout on top of them as a blind. The two fisherman cheerfully exhibited their baskets of trout to the officer, on request, but shed tears of anguish when he insisted on dumping them out and finding the birds.

The two culprits were taken before Probate Judge Reese, who imposed a fine of \$25 00 and costs on each amounting to \$29 40.

Our officers and the members of the Nezperce county sportsman association are determined to catch those shooting out of season. We are watching several others who had better go slow.

Our open season on grouse and prairie chickens is from August 15 to December 1st.

ORDINANCE NO. 83

Intituled an ordinance to prohibit the riding of bicycles on the sidewalks of the village of Kendrick Idaho.

Be it ordained by the chairman and board of Trustees of the village of Kendrick Idaho,
Sec. 1.

It shall be unlawful for any person or persons to ride a wheel or bicycle on any of the sidewalks of the Village of Kendrick Idaho.
Sec. 2.

Any person or persons who shall violate any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be subject to arrest by any legal officer and upon conviction there of shall be fined in the sum of not less than \$1.00 and no more than \$10.00 together with the cost of prosecution and in default of the payment of said fine and cost shall be imprisoned in the Village Jail at the rate of \$2.00 per day until such fine and cost is paid.

All other ordinances and parts of ordinances now in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.
Sec. 3.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its approval and publication.
Passed this 15th day of July 1903.
