That Exhibit of Ours

C. B. Hurtt, executive commissioner for the Idaho exhibit at the St. Louis and Lewis and Clark exhibitions, was here Monday and was driven out to Martin Wessels place on the Potlatch to talk over the proposed agricultural and horticultural display at the above expositions. Mr. Wessels is one of the commissioners and Mr. Hurtt naturally desired to see him and talk over matters. The executive commissioner seems to be a bustling business man and is going about his work in a systematic, careful manner that betokens a fine exhibit for Idaho along all lines. The mining exhibit of which it is proposed to make the very best possible is under the supervision of Dr. H. J. Reed of Wallace, Idaho.

The Horticultural and Agricultural display will be under the management of Martin Wessels of this place and he has been given carte blanche in the matter. We shall naturally expect one of the finest exhibits along this line that Mr. Wessels has as yet arranged. The lumbermen of the state have promised Mr. Hurtt to donate the lumber for the erection of the Idaho building and doubtless they will take great pride in giving of their very best. Already the commission has been offered use of private collections of mineral, horticultural and agricultural specimens. The amount of money appropriated by the state is \$25,000 of which a large portion will be used in preparing the exhibit, placing it on the ground and maintaining it for the time the exposition holds. The Idaho building will have an architectural beauty and arrangement that will be unique and convenient. There will be an information bureau for the benefit of Idaho visitors; this bureau will engage rooms and have all kinds of information as regards the fair, ready for the asking. Taking it all in all, the plans for the Idaho exhibit are comprehensive and sensible, aiming to treat every part of the state with equal consideration and to set forth our resources north and south in the very best manner. Mr. Hurtt went from here to Lewiston and from thence to Grangeville to arrange for exhibits for Nez Perce and Idaho counties. Mr. Wessels also went to Lewiston where he and Mr. Hurtt laid further plans for the agricultural and horticultural display.

Mr. Wessels wishes it stated that those having samples should advise with him immediately. All samples should be marked with growers name and place where grown. All prizes, medals and diplomas awarded will be sent directly to the winner.

We hope to give an article next week explaining this exhibit more fully.

They are giving the primary and intermediate rooms in the upper building a thorough overhauling, putting on a white coat over the gray plaster and revarnishing the woodwork. They have torn out the partition in the intermediate room with the big double doors, making it all one big room which will make it better for both teacher and pupil. They expect also to do some repairing on the school house at the lower end of town. The teachers for the coming year are Professor J. P. Barackman, Miss Lucile Fisher, Miss Bertha Morris and Miss McLaughlin, the latter was principal of the school at Stuart last year. With this corps of teachers the board think they will have a splendid school this year. The janitor will be chosen in a day or two.
