

BIG MINING DEAL A GO.

Chas. Sweeney's Enterprise is Now Completed.

Spokane, Aug. 26.—"The properties of the Federal Mining & Smelting Company," said Mr. Sweeney, "include the Mammoth, the Standard and Empire State properties—the Last Chance and the Tiger-Poorman—in the Coeur d'Alenes, the Puget Sound Reduction company's smelter at Everett and the Monte Cristo mining properties, hitherto owned by the Rockefeller interests.

Net Earnings \$1,500,000.

"The properties will earn net about \$1,500,000 a year," continued Mr. Sweeney. "The capitalization of the company is \$30,000,000. Of this sum \$20,000,000 is preferred stock and \$10,000,000 common stock. To purchase the various properties there was issued \$10,500,000 of preferred stock and \$5,250,000 of common stock. It is not the intention to issue any more of the stock in the immediate future.

"The new company is incorporated under the laws of the state of Delaware. Its head office will be in New York, and its Spokane office will be where the present offices of the Empire State-Idaho company are located, in the Exchange National Bank building.

"The executive committee of the directors is made up of Messrs. Gates, Gould, Packard, Sweeney and Finch.

"The officers of the new company are: President, Charles Sweeney; first vice president, Edwin Packard; second vice president, John A. Finch; general manager, E. J. Roberts; assistant general manager, W. Clayton Miller; treasurer, Bruce Glendinning; secretary and assistant treasurer, E. V. Carey."

Mr. Sweeney said the company has no intention of building a smelter in or near Spokane.

IDAHO ITEMS.

Hay is in demand at Troy.

The Snake river is very low.

There are fewer inmates in the penitentiary now than for years.

This week the Vollmer Roller mills will start up for the fall and winter run.

Tracts of fine timber lands in Shoshone county continue to bring high prices.

A recent school census of Wardner shows there are 343 school children in that city.

During the past week a number of threshing outfits have started out for the season's run.

Harvest is more than half completed in the Lewiston flat and Tammany hollow sections.

Work on the grain tramway at Kooskia is at a standstill at present owing to delay in the receipt of the heavy wire cable.

Arrangements have been about perfected for the annual Grangeville street fair, to be held September 30 to October 3.

The state board of equalization has not completed its work nor has it announced a decision on any point under consideration.

State Game Warden W. VanIrons of Hagerman, Idaho, has appointed William Gleason deputy game warden for head of St. Joe river section.

Haynes' steam thresher was burned while threshing grain four miles north of Grangeville. It was the first machine to start threshing on Camas prairie this year.

The activity of the Pennoyers, formerly prominent timber men of Saginaw, Mich., in the Ford's Creek section, contiguous to Orofino, may mean much to that section.

It is stated that mutiny exists among the officers of the Idaho National Guard, owing to the alleged interference of the adjutant general in the election of regimental officers.

The fine new excursion boat Idaho was given a practice run on Lake Coeur d'Alene recently and all the machinery was found to be in perfect running order. The steamer is not only the largest, but also the fastest passenger boat on the lake.

An option on the mills, franchises and timber and lumber holdings of the Cameron Lumber company of Harrison has been given to eastern parties, who have until October to examine the property and make a first payment. The price demanded by the Cameron company is about \$20,000.

Boat Sinks at McKeesport.

McKeesports, Pa., Aug. 24.—The Annie Roberts, an excursion boat, carrying 1500 passengers, sank here tonight, but no one was drowned. The boat had been up the river with the Ancient Order of Hibernians and their guests from Pittsburg on their annual outing.

Portland Plumbers Strike.

Portland, Ore., Aug. 27.—To bring the wage scale in Portland up to the mark set by other coast cities the union plumbers are on a strike. They have asked for \$5 a day flat.

The Thirtieth battery, United States field artillery, is in camp on the St. Joe river, one mile above its mouth.

Twelfth Census.

The twelfth census takes ten quarto volumes, ten thousand pages, to hold its condensed information—information of vital importance touching our population, our agriculture, our manufactures, and our vital statistics "Noteworthy results" of this twelfth census will be presented by the Hon. W. R. Merriam, director of census, in the September Century. Figures will be quoted, among other topics, on the rapid growth of population, interstate migrations, city and country residence, illiteracy conditions, the status of agriculture and manufactures, the growth of trusts and expansion in the export trade.
