SCHOOL NOTES

The plasterers finished white coating the Principal's room this week while the lower school has been clothed and papered and the wood-work touched up inside. With the repairing and cleaning of the building Kendrick has now one of the neatest and coziest schools in the county. It looks as though we would have one of the most prosperous years of our school history. There will probably be in the neighborhood of 15 or 20 from the outside that will enter at the eighth grade and above, while there will be quite a large number also from other districts that will enter the lower grades.

The school will open next Monday, September 21st. The teachers are all on the ground and are eager to commence work. The present board of education has been enabled to do so much repairing and cleaning this year through the economy and good management of the old board and we are sure the patrons of the school will be delighted at the improvements that have been made.

In the matter of tuition for school children from outside districts, the same rate will be charged as last year, one dollar and fifty cents a month for all under the eighth grade and two dollars per month for all over the eighth grade. This tuition will be collected in advance. If three months are paid for at once the price will be \$4 for those under the eighth grade and \$5 for all above it.

A Deserved Honor

A. W. Gordon returned Sunday from Boise where he was in attendance upon the Masonic Grand Lodge.

Mr. Gordon was elected Deputy Grand Master of the state which is an honor well deserved as he is one of the best informed and most enthusiastic members of the order in the workings of the fraternity in the state. This places him next in line for the chair of the Grand Master next year. We congratulate him on his position. He returned very much impressed with the future of Southern Idaho, when the big irrigation schemes are completed that are now in progress. He spent a day with Eugene Emerson visiting around Nampa and saw the country to splendid advantage. In conversation as to the session of the grand lodge Mr. Gordon informed us that it was a most successful one, several important laws being passed which will materially improve the order in the state.

Mr. Ward of Lewiston was honored with the office of junior warden so that the North was well recognized in the apportionment of honors.

COUNCIL PROCEEDINGS

The council met Monday evening in called session, all members being present except H. N. Nelson. The minutes of the previous meeting were read and approved and the chairman explained the purpose of the meeting as being the consideration of the appointment of a night watchman and repealing ordinance No. 79 regarding stock running at large in the village of Kendrick. The report of the street and alley committee was read, recommending the appointment of a night watchman at a salary not to exceed forty dollars per month, he to serve from the hours of 1 p. m. to midnight. The report was amended so as to read that he serve from 3 p. m. to 3 a. m. and adopted. There were three applications for the place from John Sandberg, J. Davis and S. A. Bechtol, and the council proceeded to ballot on these names, resulting after a number of ballots in the election of John Sandberg. The clerk was instructed to notify him of his election and that he held office at the pleasure of the council.

Ordinance No. 85 repealing ordinance 79, relative to stock running at large, failed to pass and the old ordinance was continued.

On recommendation of street and alley committee the city attorney was instructed to notify all parties who have any street and alley enclosed with fence, to vacate the same at once.

The chairman and clerk were instructed to sign the necessary papers in connection with the application of the village of Kendrick for permission to construct and maintain a water ditch to pass under the N. P. R. R. and to draw a warrant for one dollar as ground rent for said ditch for the five years.

The council then adjourned to meet in regular session October 7th.


