TURKEY AND BULGARIA BATTLE

ARMIES ON THE FRONTIER ENGAGE IN WAR.

Both Sides Sustain Heavy Losses—Excitement is Intense at Sofia—24,000 Recruits Called Three Months Before Usual Time—Cavalry Sent to the Front.

Sofia, Oct. 6.—Serious news has been received here from the frontier of fighting between Turkish and Bulgarian troops at Demir-Kapia, both sides sustaining losses.

In official circles all knowledge of the affair is denied, but the circumstantial details given seem to indicate that there is some foundation for the accounts of the conflict.

According to one report, the Turks attacked the Bulgarian frontier posts. Another version says the Turks pursued a number of refugees across the frontier.

It is asserted that the Turks have frequently attempted to provoke hostilities, firing into Bulgarian territory and crossing the frontier to steal horses and sheep.

The war office here is working at high pressure and 24,000 recruits will be called three months before the usual time. Prince Ferdinand has sanctioned numerous other measures of a warlike nature. All the cavalry, with the exception of a single regiment, which is stationed at Sofia, has been sent into the frontier districts, where are strong forces of artillery. Vigorous efforts are being made to prevent bands from crossing into Turkish territory. Two bands which were sent back have reached Sofia since yesterday.

Dispatches from the frontier received at the revolutionary headquarters report that the refugees in the mountains are in a terrible condition through their pursuit by the Turks and cold and hunger. Many are dying.

Salonica, Oct. 6.—The Bulgarian notables here went to the government palace and informed the authorities that a series of fresh outrages in
