A FOUL MURDER AT TROY REPUBLICAN CONVENTION

MARSHAL HAYS SHOT

Kendrick was very much stirred up Wednesday evening by the report that Marshal Hays of Troy had been killed while attempting to arrest a man at that place. Little more than this could be learned but Thursday papers contained a full and accurate account of the tragedy. It seems that Payne Sly a well known laboring man of Troy, after loading up on bad whiskey went to his home and began to abuse his family. He fired several shots in the house and his daughter ran to a house crying out that "Papa has killed Mama." Marshal Hays having been sent for, went to the Sly home where he was met at the door by Sly and ordered away. Hays attempted to enter the house when Sly shot at him with a rifle that he held in his hand but missed him. Hays then began firing and tried to re-enter the house. Sly then shot at him making a fearful wound and severing the jugular vein. After firing another shot Hays ran about 75 yards and fell dead; Sly, after shooting the officer fired at several other men who were near, but luckily missed them. In a few minutes his house was surrounded by a body of citizens who commenced firing, driving Sly out of the house through the woods to his father's house not far distant. It was soon surrounded and the murderer was compelled to surrender. There were strong threats made of lynching him but he was taken to Moscow and safely lodged in the county jail. He is about 25 years old and has a quarrelsome disposition, frequently abusing his wife when drunk.

The murdered man was about 60 years of age and is a veteran of the civil war. He has been town marshal of Troy for ten or twelve years and was recognized as one of the most fearless men in the country. He did more probably than any citizen there to keep the community well governed and protected. Hays was a member of the I. O. O. F. and had been instrumental in building up a strong lodge at Troy. His death will be greatly regretted through this whole region where he was so well known. He leaves a wife and two children.

TROUBLE BREWING

The republican state committee today decided on Moscow as the place and August 10 as the date for the convention to select delegates to the national convention. The apportionment for each convention is two delegates at large and one for each 130 votes or majority fraction thereof cast for the republican candidate for secretary of state in 1902. Ada county has the largest number with 26. North Idaho counties are as follows: Kootenai, 17; Idaho, 15; Latah, 18; Nez Perce, 20; Shoshone, 23.

Resolutions were adopted indorsing President Roosevelt's administration, and in favor of instructing delegates for him; also indorsing the course of Senator Heyburn and Congressman French in sustaining the recommendations of the committee in reference to federal appointments.

One resolution says:

"We deprecate and condemn any and all efforts to create misunderstanding, dissention or friction within the ranks of the party in this state by an attempted revival of political issues long since dead and forgotten, based upon difference of religious belief."

This declaration has created a furor of opposition and materially widens the breach in the party. It is regarded in certain republican circles as an implied indorsement of Mormon participation in politics, and these openly charge Chairman Gooding and other members of the organization with having capitulated to the church in return for its support for their personal ambitions.

No attempt is made to disguise the fact that the party is split wide open on the Mormon issue.

MORE LAND FOR FILING

Its On the North Fork

Word has been received from the land office at Lewiston that the plats of the following townships have been received there and will be placed on file February 24th. Townships 33, 39 and 40 north, ranges 5 and 6 east. The state has sixty days prior, right after which filing by others will be accepted. The land is situated on the north fork of the Clearwater and is mostly fine timber. The Northern Pacific has scriped large pieces of this and the settlers have jumped the scrip so there will be a contest over the scrip filings. April, 25, 1904 at nine A. M. the filing of settlers will be received at the land office.
