

### Affects Homestead Proof

Land Office Receives Circular on the President's Modified Order.

The local land office has received a circular from the general land office department relative to the President's modified order, it appears now. In comparing the regulations before and after the issuance of the order of January 25 that the only material changes are in two particulars.

The first of these is that the personal examination and report of the special agents is confined to completed homestead proofs, and the second that in all classes of claims the register and receiver are barred from passing proof until a report is had from the special agent.
