LAND DISPUTE SETTLED

Southern Idaho Farmers Join in Opposition to Promoters.

Boise.—The state land board has settled the question of the irrigation of 14,000 acres of high land on the benches in Lincoln County over which there has been a bitter controversy, by voting to give the contract for the pumping and the irrigation of the project to the Kuhn interests and the Twin Falls North Side Land & Water Company, fixing the price per acre at \$60. Governor Jas. H. Hawley and Stephen D. Taylor, state auditor, stood out against the letting of the contract, declaring that specification should be made as to the time when the company would deliver the water.

This project and the land included within it is in the southern part of this state in Lincoln County. There is opposition in that section against the Twin Falls North Side Land & Water Company among the settlers who declare that the promise to deliver water by that enterprise has not been fulfilled and settlers have suffered a loss. They therefore objected to this company taking over the pumping plant proposition, and attempted to organize another company to bid for it.

Chehalis.—In the Lewis County superior court a jury awarded Evan O. Edwards the full amount of a judgment of \$7500 asked for personal injuries suffered while employed in the Napavine sawmill of Somerville Brothers. Edwards lost his right arm while at work.


