JAMES H. BRADY

Candidate for United States Senator to succeed himself, subject to the will of the Republican voters at the Primary election to be held Tuesday, September 1, 1914. A partial list of committees Senator Brady has been appointed to by the administrator. Agriculture and forestry, conservation of national resources, military affairs, public buildings and grounds, national banks, coast and insular survey, public health and national quarantine, expenditures in the department of commerce.

The following quotation is the stand taken by him on the questions of Farmers and Miners in Idaho:

"The tariff bill was the first bill to come before Congress, after his election to the Senate, vitally affecting the welfare of the State of Idaho. This bill, as approved by the administration, seemed especially aimed at practically every industry in the State of Idaho. While those who for years opposed protection have declared that the tariff was the 'mother of trusts,' very strangely in framing this bill the hardest blow was aimed at the farmers who have never been accused of combining and who could not form a monopoly even if they were so inclined.

This bill instead of striking at the woolen trust, which is engaged only in the manufacturing end of the woolen business and has its mills

principally in the Eastern States, left a duty on manufactured wools and removed all of the duty from raw wool, of which the state of Idaho produces an enormous amount. In other words, the wool trust was favored and the wool grower was left without any protection whatever.

So it was with all the products of the farm. This law carried with it the implication that the American farmer was principally to blame for the increased cost of living against which there had been such universal complaint, and it is interesting to note at this day that, altogether the farmer is receiving less for his products, the 'ultimate consumer' of whom so much was said in the tariff discussions, has not been able to detect any appreciable lowering in the cost of living."

We are growing fast, needed public improvements, roads, building, etc., and as money was coming in from the outside, we did not feel the constantly increasing burden. In our pride of state we thought we should have all the fancy boards and commissions, fads and frills, of a state of ten times our wealth and population. We have got them. As a result we have probably a larger proportion of our people living entirely, or drawing partial aid, from our tax monies than any other state in the Union. The burden of taxation is so great on all kinds of property within the state, that values are gradually being destroyed; emigration is passing us by, and people now here must stay because no way offers of getting away. Taxes are higher in some sections than others, but the feeling that taxes must be reduced, and reduced radically, is state-wide. It is the one Great question.
