**Hens Need Animal Food.**  
Beef scrap is the most convenient  
form in which to feed animal food.  
This is a byproduct of the large pack-  
ing houses and contains meat and bone  
in varying proportions which have gone  
through a boiling and drying process.  
It contains, therefore, little moisture  
compared with fresh meat scraps. It  
varies considerably in composition, but  
should contain from 50 to 60 per cent  
protein. Beef scrap varies also in qual-  
ity. It should be light colored, with a  
meaty flavor and somewhat oily to the  
touch. When boiling water is poured  
over it should have a fresh, meaty  
flavor. If it gives off a putrid odor  
don't feed it.
