## ROSELEAF WON THE PURSE

### "Opening Handicap" Stake Race Carried off Yesterday by the Parker Mare

The fair this year can boast of as good a string of horses as has ever visited the race meetings held here. The races yesterday were exceptionally good as well as interesting and the crowd at the track were in good humor and thoroughly enjoyed the events. The association has provided an excellent program for the week and the events pulled off yesterday were live and the good management in promptly disposing of each race is to be commended. There were two events yesterday on the track of special merit they being the 2:14 pace for \$1,000 won by Queen B. in three straight heats and the "Opening Handicap" for 3 1/2 furlongs for a purse of \$250. The latter was a running race and was won by Roseleaf after an exciting finish. In this event there were six entries. Big Dutch, Scorch, Young Pepper, Joe Jewett, Roseleaf, Dix second started and there were many who professed to be next to the game that Big Dutch should have taken the money but Roseleaf carried off the prize after trailing third place nearly to the wire when she forged ahead. When the flag dropped Big Dutch was off in the lead with Joe Jewett following close in. Roseleaf was in the midst of the rest of the string until the home stretch when it was noticed that the jockey was urging the Parker mare with the bat flying. Big Dutch was galloping along with little effort and kept the lead for the full length of the stretch. Joe Jewett was singled out as a close second. The crowd in the grand stand were on edge and there was little thought that Big Dutch would give way to another. Just as the wire was almost reached Roseleaf forged ahead of Jewett and Big Dutch winning by a neck. Big Dutch took second money and Joe Jewett third the time being :43 1/2.

Queen B. in the 2:14 pace was the pride of the track in the big event yesterday and sold favorite in the pools. From the remarks that could be heard among those who were supposed to know there wasn't anything to expect from the balance of the entries. Those entered were Queen B., Prince Charles, King Altamont, Hellenes, Prince Tom. The race was for the best three in five and Queen B. won in three straight heats with Prince Charles in second money for the first two heats and Hellenes took second money in the third heat.

The rest of the races were equally as interesting and brought out much favorable comment from the grand stand audience. The race results for the balance of the week promise to be just as interesting and there is little doubt but what the fair visitors will be loud in their praises.




