SENATOR HEYBURN is in Washington getting acquainted with the senators, and "getting onto the ropes."

RAILROAD wrecks are becoming so common that the daily papers use the words "Usual Daily Railroad Wrecks" as a headline.

THE Delaware legislature ended its deadlock Monday by electing two senators, James Frank Allee for the long term and Louis H. Ball for the short term.

MORE protests reached Washington last week against the seating of Hon. Reed Smoot. Notwithstanding the various protests and charges against Mr. Smoot, he will probably be seated.

AN investigation of the democratic management of the state penitentiary has been going on, the result of which substantiates the investigation conducted by Attorney General Martin before election.

THE time is drawing nigh when a new board of village trustees must be elected. The present board, which is republican, has ably performed its duty and we suggest that another republican ticket be placed before the people of St. Anthony.

THE Idaho legislature has accepted an invitation to go prowling around Salt Lake City on a visit to the Utah legislature. It appears to the PEAK that these senators and representatives have business at Boise to transact which requires their undivided attention. It naturally occurs to the voter that they were not sent down to Boise to visit Salt Lake City, but to transact the people's business.

WHILE there may be some objection to emblems being placed on the election ballots from an ethical or artistic point of view, yet we believe under the Australian system of voting which obtains in this state, the mere placing of emblems on the tickets will not interfere with an intelligent voting of any ticket, neither will it encourage fraud or corruption. The placing of a circle at the top of the ticket to enable the voter to vote a straight ticket is a convenience to the voter and to the counter of the ballot, and should have been on the ticket from the beginning.—Caldwell Tribune.

COL. THOMAS R. HAMER sent a telegram Tuesday to Representative Moore stating that he was not a candidate for the appointment of judge of the new judicial district, and the colonel joined with Judge Thompson in a recommendation to the governor that he appoint Attorney Caleb Jones, of St. Anthony. This knocked the wind out of some of our democratic attorneys who have wasted their time and writing material endorsing candidates outside of the county. A man is a fool who will not stand by his own county candidates and a man is a bigger fool who will dabble in republican politics with a democratic sign hanging to his record. Fremont county is entitled to the judgeship of the 6th district, and we hope the governor can see his way clear to appoint Mr. Jones.

EXTRA SESSION LOOKED FOR.

It is regarded in Washington that an extra session of the senate is almost inevitable. The determination of the advocates of both the Cuban reciprocity and Panama Canal treaties to secure their ratification continues firm. If this can not be done before congress adjourns they will do it at an extra session of the senate. It is said that there is a clear majority in the senate in favor of both these treaties and that no other business will be permitted to interfere with their consideration.

Later: Since the above was set in type, the president has issued a proclamation calling for an extra session of the senate, which convenes at noon today.

SIGNED BY GOVERNOR.

Governor Morrison appended his official signature last Saturday to the following bills:

Making an appropriation for a bridge across Snake river at Weiser.

Authorizing divorces in cases of insanity after six years.

Prohibiting the sending of public printing and binding out of the state and providing punishment for violation of the act.

Fixing terms of trustees of independent school trustees at three years.

Regulating the duties of horticultural inspectors and making more effective regulations for eradication of fruit pests.

Primary elections for the establishment of the boundary line between Lemhi and Idaho counties.

For an issue of \$30,000 bonds for additional buildings at Poacello academy.

Relating to recovery of property other than real and amending section 4055 of the revised statutes.

Authorizing merchant's lien suits in probate courts.

The defeat of the eight-hour bill in the Idaho legislature is causing no small amount of comment. The republicans opposed the measure purely from a point of law, claiming that the bill, if passed, would not, nor could not benefit the miners because of its unconstitutionality.
