No one denies the benefit of a good, brisk open air walk of 28 inches to the step, and yet how much greater is the advantage to be derived from an easy ride where the lungs can be filled with pure country air while going from 6 to 8 feet at every pedal stroke. The coaster brake has removed the danger in descending steep hills and in turning sharp curves, the cushion frame has overcome the vibration and jar of rough roads, the self-oiling hubs, crank-hanger pedals have done away with the constant dismounting to oil the bearings, the use of large sprockets has reduced the strain on the chain and made hill-climbing an easy accomplishment. In fact the modern Racycle has turned drudgery into pastime and made play of what was once work. Thousands are being sold all over the country until there is scarcely a town in the entire United States where the observant may not see someone mounted on a Racycle. For a time the chainless wheels seemed to have secured a foothold, but the unprejudiced owners are gradually discarding them for chain wheels on account of the constant expense of necessary repairs, but more especially since they undoubtedly push much harder than chain driven wheels.

Drifting Straws Show the Current's Trend.

Increasing Sales of the "Racycle" Evidence That Cycling is Again a Popular Sport.

That cycling is again becoming a popular sport is evinced by the constantly increasing sales and the continuous demands for immediate shipments out at the Miami Cycle works.

The "Bicycling World" predicts a considerable shortage of bikes this season, for the demand seems to be greater than the few remaining factories can supply, while at least one of the larger concerns has already issued a warning circular that on account of the shortage of steel the scarcity of coal, the continuous freight blockades and the advance in prices, that there will be a scarcity of bicycles during the coming season and urges the dealers to increase their sample orders before they are all gone.

The dealers are awake to the knowledge that bicycles have again become a profitable investment. All this is interesting when we remember that at one time there were no less than 280 large bicycle factories in the United States alone, and that today there are less than 25 mills devoted exclusively to the manufacture of wheels.

The high water mark of bicycling was reached in 1895 and '96 and with the receding wave of the fad, the wealthier class of riders either turned their wheels over to their children or sold them at greatly reduced prices to those who had never been able to own bicycles on account of the high prices then in vogue. Thus in America, the bicycle soon became the children's plaything, the poor man's horse or the laborer's rapid transit although in Europe and foreign countries the fad is still on and growing larger every day.

A fad worked as a fad is usually overdone and deteriorates from over indulgence. The healthy, exhilarating effects from an easy ride of eight or ten miles per day was counteracted by the quick, exhaustive road tours of from 20 to 50 miles or more. Often weak women who could have been made strong and robust by the right sort of bicycling, were worn out or overcome by trying to keep up with the bunch of stronger friends in their "follow my leader" rush over the country. All this occurred before the art of bicycle building had reached anywhere near perfection. It was in the days of the old fashioned rigid frames, constantly jarring and jolting, when the saddles were little better than blocks of wood, when clumsy chains ran on small sprockets, when the frames were heavy and the tires nearly as bulky as fire engine hose, when it required almost as much exertion to propel an ordinary bicycle as it did to push a wheelbarrow.

Since that time, each year has brought forth such marked changes and improvements that the lady riders of five or six years ago would recognize a vast difference if they could be induced to try a ride on a light cushion frame, self-oiling machine, with a one-eighth chain on large sprockets, protected by a light wire chain guard, mounted on a soft coaster saddle over a free running rear wheel and a wheel there is no fatiguing pedal exertion, no jolting or straining, for the cushion mechanism absorbs the jar and vibration and the rider experiences a gentle yielding action that is both restful and enjoyable.

The steady increase of sales is doubtless due to the realization of worth of the styles in bicycles from a hygienic standpoint. This has been made manifest by the vigor of the young men and women, who took up the discarded wheels of their parents in 1896 and 1897, and began riding to school or for play and have continued the use of bicycles
