Woman Borrows \$1,000,000 on Forged Certificates.

Mrs. Cassie Chadwick, of Cleveland, Ohio, has succeeded in borrowing \$1,000,000 from banks and trust companies. The great bulk of the money was borrowed on notes to which Andrew Carnegie's name had been forged. The woman's method was unique. She would deposit the forged securities with a bank, taking a receipt therefor. One bank gave her a receipt for securities bearing a face value of \$5,000,000. By showing this receipt, and by spreading fairy tales of her wealth, she was enabled to borrow this enormous sum. The actual securities she has are valued at only \$27,000, and will pay only 1 1/2 mills on the dollar.

Mount Sangay is the most active volcano in the world. It is situated in Ecuador, is 17,120 feet in height, and has been in constant activity since 1728. The sounds of its eruptions are sometimes heard in Quito, 150 miles distant, and 267 reports were once counted in one hour.

Chinese Compelled to Wear it by Their Manchu Conquerors.

The celestial's pigtail, in which he takes great pride, and over the plaiting of which he takes any amount of trouble, is really the badge of slavery. Before the rise of the Manchu supremacy, Chinamen wore no tails or queues, but the conquerors from the north gradually enforced this outward and visible sign of China's humiliation, and each province, one after the other, adopted the practice of wearing long hair and plaiting it up in a coil with cotton or silk. One clan at least, to this day, indirectly repudiates the degradation by wearing at times a turban in which the pigtail is hidden away. Chinamen, while at work or in the house, may, for the sake of convenience, coil their queue round their head, but it is a sign of much disrespect whenever they do so in the presence of a visitor or superior or in public.
