

Commissioners Proceedings

St. Anthony, Idaho, April 10th, 1905.

On this day the Honorable Board of County Commissioners of Fremont County, Idaho, convened, as per requirement of the statutes.

Present: George A. Cordon, chairman; E. S. Little and R. J. Costlev, commissioners; Clerk, Victor Hegsted and county attorney, O. P. Soule. The following proceeding were had to wit: The following bonds for the sale of intoxicating liquors were carefully examined and are hereby approved: Berger and Buchner, Driggs, Ida., Oakley and Ellis, Dubois, Ida., Phillip J. Ritter, Labelle, Ida., J. E. Secrist Marysville, Ida.

In the matter of the petition of Chas. H. Smith and 75 others for the opening of a county road between Camas Meadows and St. Anthony: It is hereby ordered that said petition be granted and Good Rasmussen, Fred Schaller and C. P. Bartlett are hereby appointed to locate and define the boundaries of said road, and it is further ordered that an appropriation of \$50 be made towards opening said road to travel.

In the matter of the petition of P. S. Roose and 30 others for the opening of a county road at Poplar: It is hereby ordered that said petition be granted and said road opened as follows: Beginning at the northeast corner of section 32 twp 4, n., r 40, E B M., and running thence north between sections 28 and 29 same twp and range, one mile. In the matter of the report of Albert Baezer, Thos Atkinson and J D Nelson, viewers heretofore appointed to view a county road at Labelle, petitioned for by S A Browning, Alma Olson, et al, to wit: Commencing at the SW corner of NW 1/4 SW 1/4 sec 27, twp 5, R 39 E, B M., running thence east one mile to east line of sec 27, thence south 1/4 mile to SW corner of NW 1/4 sec 35, thence east on half section line about 150 rods to north bank of Bannock Jim Wash, thence following said bank in semi-circle course for about 70 rods till intersecting the half section line again, thence east along line 1/4 mile to intersect county road in section 36. The said petition is hereby denied for the reason that the cost of opening said road as reported by the viewers is too expensive for the interests of the county.

The petition of D S Taylor and 25 others of Kilgore precinct for 12,000 feet plank for bridge purposes is hereby denied.

In the matter of the petition of S S Green and 30 others residents of Fremont county for the construction of a bridge across Fall river near Farnum, said petition is hereby denied.

On petition of Willard Homer and others Alma Rammell is appointed overseer of Haden district No. 9.

On petition of Robert Fisher et al, Clark Jackson is appointed overseer of Plano road district. On petition of Anton Edinger and 30 others and it appearing that there will be no expense to Fremont county, the old road running from Market Lake to Howe, through the property of Joseph A Levina, is hereby laid upon the following lines: Beginning where said road now crosses the Butte and Market Lake canal and running north to ditch a distance of about 20 rods, thence west along said west line of section 32, thence south to the road again. It is understood that Jos. Levina will make the new road as good as the old road is now.

On petition of F A Pyke et al, the clerk of this board is authorized to advertise for sealed bids for the construction of a bridge across Camas creek, said bids to be opened at the next meeting of this board.

It appearing that in the year 1900 and 1901 the sw 1/4 se 1/4 sec 23 twp 8n, r 41 e, b m was assessed to J E Hathaway and taxes paid and it also appearing that same property was assessed to J W Hathaway and sold to county for such tax: It is ordered that said sale be canceled same being a double assessment.

In the matter of the petition of A S West and 70 others for the opening of a county road from Marysville and Squirrel and into Teton Basin: It appearing that a proper bond has been filed, it is ordered that J H Egbert, O E Peterson and Chris Hanson be appointed to view and lay out said road and report at the next meeting of this board.

On petition of Joseph Gale and 50 others it is ordered that an appropriation of \$50 00 be made for the repair of the County road on the hill west of Teton River Bridge, said repairs are to be made under the supervision of the road overseer of said district.

On petition of Ben F Gillett and 80 others it is ordered that an appropriation of \$100 be made for the grading of the county road between Teton and Sugar City. Said money to be expended under the supervision of the road overseer of said district.

Whereas in the year 1903, 4 x 12 rods in E 1/2 N 1/2 block 40, Rexburg, Idaho, was assessed to J N Cook and whereas in said year the south 5 rods of said lot was assessed to an unknown owner, and whereas the records show the property to be in the name of a widow, Mrs Dora Clegg, the said sale is hereby cancelled.

1st. For removing a 100 foot span from the bridge over the Dry Bed of Snake river and filling in with gravel.

2nd. For building 6 or more timber and rock piers in the North Fork of Snake river near Mosier Ranch for the purpose of changing the current of the Snake river.

3rd. For constructing a vault adjoining the County vault, same size. The annual financial Statement of the Auditor was examined and is hereby approved.
