Beans. The common bean is believed to have originated in the East, and is still said to be found wild in Persia and other parts of Central Asia.

There are a number of varieties grown from the several species, the most remarkable of which are the French kidney bean (haricot) which has been raised from the seed of the "phaseolus vulgaris," the sword bean of India and the Lima bean of America, both of which are of the species known as "dolichos."

Beans require for their successful growth rich, well-prepared soil, which they do not exhaust; they love oblong pods with round seeds, and those which are to be used for dried seed, others which have thick, fleshy pods, have small flattened seeds; these are consumed more for the vegetable nature of the pods than for the seeds within them, and are termed string beans. When they are dried the pods are useless, and the seed or the bean proper is the valuable feature.

Beans were well known to the ancients, many of whom looked upon them unfavorably. This is supposed to have resulted from certain mystic properties being attributed to them, and from their being used in incantations and other occult ceremonies. They were also frequently used as ballots, the white for the affirmative and the black for the negative.

Pythagoras urged abstinence from beans, believing their use would produce sensuality and grossness; the Egyptian priests objected to their use on like grounds, and believed that even the sight of beans rendered one unclean; no one who even cultivated the plant was permitted to approach a temple or shrine until they had performed certain stringent ablutions.

String and Lima beans have both become favorite articles for canning, and are hermetically sealed in large quantities, which meet with great demand and large consumption. Limas are especially regarded with favor, as it is a difficult matter when properly canned to distinguish them from the fresh article.

Dishes Made of Paper. The latest application of paper is the adoption of paper plates by some of the great restaurants and cafes in Berlin. The innovation was first introduced during the summer of last year by the adventurous landlord of a much-frequented open-air restaurant. Every customer who ordered bread and butter, rolls, cakes, butts or similar articles, had them served to him on a little paper plate, made of light paper mache, adorned with a pretty border in relief, and having, at the first glance, a great similarity to porcelain.
