REVIEW OF THE WEEK.

Additions to the Working Force at Bullion—New Strike in the Idahoan—A Fine Ore Breast—The Sawtooth and Smokey Roads Open—Etc.

Nothing of any great importance occurred during the past week. Work is going on as usual in the mines, and every outgoing team is loaded to its utmost capacity with ore from Bullion.

At the Idahoan mine a new development was made yesterday. A miner putting in a stull picked out a chunk of iron ore from what was supposed to be the casing of the ledge, and saw galena back of it.

David Falk, one of the owners, has put a crew of ten men to work in the Star mine, getting things in shape to extract ore. The breast is 1 1/2 feet wide, of ore that will average 130 ounces silver to the ton.

The arrival of Robert E. Strahorn, of the Union Pacific Literary Bureau, and the positive assurances which he gave of the early completion of the line to Little Wood river, removed all doubts which may have remained upon that point.

At Ketchum, the Philadelphia Company's smelter is ready to resume operations, and I only await the arrival of the leading stockholders of the company, who are on their way here.

The grade over the range being open for pack animals, the rush to Sawtooth and Vienna has commenced, but the Superintendents of mines of that section (with the exception of J. S. Wallace, of the Solace) are still out of the Territory.

MULDON.

A Reliable Report from that New Camp. Mr. Cramer, of this city, paid Muldon a visit, last week, and returned last Saturday. At the time of his visit there were 12 tents, one log-house with canvas roof, three stores, three saloons, and three club-houses in Muldon, and the place was very dull.
