TROUBLE IN THE CAMP.

How the Hon. George Ainslie, the Democratic Nominee, Secured the Nomination for Delegate to Congress—He Only Got 11 Legal Votes out of 38.

The policy of uniting the Democratic party to the Mormon Church in this Territory has from the first had a quasi-opposition in their own ranks. Conscientious, well-meaning Democrats do not see where the necessity comes in for allying their party to a beastly, polygamous organization.

These men who live in polygamy in defiance of the laws of the United States, and who are disfranchised by law from voting at any election and from holding office, cast one-quarter of the whole vote that nominated Mr. Ainslie as the standard bearer of the Democratic party.
