THE ROAD TO CAMAS.

IT IS COMPLETED AND ACCEPTED BY THE CITIZENS.

The Grade is Light, Short, and Wide Enough for a 12-Mule Team to Swing with Ease, and the New Road Saves 13 Miles to Hailey, the County Seat.

The new stage and freight road from Camas prairie to Hailey is completed, and has been examined and accepted by the citizens' committee of Hailey, who report that they are agreeably surprised at the easy grade and amount of work done for the money expended.

Hailey, as the county seat, outside of other advantages, as a market for the outer country and a supply-point for the mining districts of the Wood and Salmon rivers, is necessarily visited by every miner and capitalist coming to the country, and during each term of court especially, and throughout the entire year, by many from the Pacific coast via Winnemucca, Pendleton, or Boise City.

The old way of travel was a circuitous one, and while 13 miles longer than the new road just opened, was also much rougher, crossing rocky plains and steep grades. The new Hailey stage and freight road leaves the main traveled road from Hailey to Bullion, and commences at what is known as Frenchmen's Stacks, eight miles west of town, on the East branch of Camp creek, to which point the old traveled road is upon a very easy grade scarcely perceptible. To within a short distance of the divide between Smokey and Wood River the new road continues on this grade, and through a romantic scenery and a natural pass in the steep cliffs on the head of Camp creek, when the only up-grade encountered, which is for a distance of only 100 yards, is 13 inches to the rod. It then varies from a level to a grade to the summit, 2 1/2 miles, the grade at any point not being over 12 inches rise to the rod, or three-fourths of an inch to the foot. Upon the summit the view is remarkable, as for miles away, as far as the eye can reach, the great Snake river country is in view with all its net-work of roads and the lava beds; while away in the dim distance the Snake river is seen.

Descending only 2 1/2 miles upon a similar grade to the one to the summit the stage station on Camas prairie is reached, which is upon the present Boise and Wood River stage road, and known as Tomley's station. It is seen that the worst grade on the road is half-way up to the divide, and is not over 13 inches in 16 feet—and this is only for 100 yards, while the average of the grade is only 12 inches to the rod, and the length of the grade is one mile only—all the balance of the road being level. The grade around from the same station on Camas, via Rock creek and Bellevue, is much steeper, while it is 13 miles longer to Hailey than by the new road. In fact, the new road is two miles shorter than by the first survey, and it is therefore 2 miles shorter from Tomley's station to Bellevue via Hailey, than from the station at Rock creek to Bellevue, and the travel from Camas prairie, Boise and all points west, can now save 13 miles to Hailey, besides having much easier grades. But Bellevue is also benefited by the new road. The old stage road distance from Boise to Bellevue is 135 miles, and to Hailey 140 miles; the new road from Boise to Bellevue is only 132 miles long, and to Hailey 127 miles. Any freight team that can pull a load from Boise to Tomley's, on Camas prairie, can bring it over the new road to Hailey.

Last Sunday, J. M. Banfield and Jos. Morrill, of Hailey, drove the entire distance over the new road, which is of course soft as yet from the shovel, and with a four-horse wagon team, and passengers made the trip of five miles in 50 minutes and returned in the same time. There is no place on the road where a freighter need use anything but his brake. The entire road is broad and level, with no stones and no place where a 12-mule team cannot swing with room to spare, and no part of the grade is dangerous to get off of. The road is nearly straight, and any team may trot over it the entire distance.

Mr. Maxon, one of the contractors, pulled up 1,200 pounds in a four-horse wagon, with only two small horses, over the fresh road; and when the road gets hard it will be a fine drive to the summit and to Camas prairie, and will doubtless be resorted to by many Haileyites. John Hailey, Superintendent of the Utah, Idaho and Oregon Stage Company, drove over the road yesterday to examine it, and intends having a main station built on Camas at or near Tomley's from which the Boise overland stages will come into Hailey and then to Bellevue over the new road—which is just a stage-drive of 13 miles. It is a fine stage road all the way, and all the grain, produce, hay, etc., from Boise and Camas and lumber from the mills will come direct to Hailey, and the Bellevue travel will also come this way. The road is as good, as a carriage, stage or freight road, as the legal fence in Iowa, which must be horse-high, pig-tight, and bull strong.
