THE HAILEY SCHOOL FUND.

It is in Such Good Condition that the Special Tax May Not Be Collected.

The Board of Trustees intend to have the Hailey schoolhouse clap-boarded, and to make other repairs soon, so as to open the school at an early day. The parents are beginning to complain that their children are spoiling by running about the streets.

The special tax of one-half of one per cent. levied a short time ago by the Trustees will doubtless be reduced one-half, and may not be collected at all. The taxable property of Hailey is expected to reach a quarter of a million dollars. If it does, then the tax will be reduced. If it goes much beyond that, then the tax will be rescinded. This will, however, depend more upon the receipts from fines and the percentage from gambling licenses, which are turned over to the school fund. At present it looks as if the income from this source would pay the teachers' salaries.

F. H. Spencer and Harry Eyre left for upper Wood River, this morning, with a camp and fishing outfit. They will take a contract for supplying Charles Moore's restaurant the next 30 days with fresh mountain trout.

Jack Rafter and J. Clark, owners of the Emery mine, Deer Creek, struck a fine body of ore day before yesterday. They purchased two pack mules yesterday, to pack the ore out, and will ship immediately. Good boys!

Several prominent mining men are yet examining mines on the river, and they should be afforded every advantage and facility. The jiggers on the Bullion and Jay Gould mines are at work, and presently increased shipments of ore will be made.

Professor Jenney, who purchased the Saturn group of claims, at Bullion, recently, is in Salt Lake, and not expected back for over a week. Professor Jenney has been one of the most active well-doers for Wood River interests who has come to the country since its discovery.

The water ditch which has been running down Wall street, in Bullion, is to be abandoned, and the water led through a new ditch to the jigger of the Mavflower mine. The ditch is now being built, and will avoid the formation of ice in the streets of Bullion during wintry weather.

W. P. Walsh, member of the Arkansas Legislature, and the only Republican who ever went to the Legislature from Garland District, arrived in town this morning and will look over the country and catch on if satisfied, and will later visit Helena, Montana, and return via Denver to Arkansas.
