

ANOTHER SMELTER NEEDED.

The relations between the Wood River mine-owners and the local smelters are anything but satisfactory. There is no denying that. As a matter of fact, they are worse than unsatisfactory, as they have recently been entirely disrupted with several of the leading mine-owners by their refusal to sell any more ore to the smelters at the price which was offered for them; and the shipment of ore to Salt Lake and the East has, in consequence, been resumed. This being the case, and the yield of the mineral increasing with depth, it is evident that a good field exists here for a first-class smelter. Since it pays to ship our ore to Salt Lake and Omaha, Kansas City, and elsewhere, in bulk, it would undoubtedly pay to reduce them here, and only ship the resulting bullion.

The fact that wages and other expenses are somewhat higher here does not cut much of a figure, because when works are conducted on a large scale these are always reduced to a minimum, and the extra cost, over other localities, of a given quantity of smelting, is comparatively insignificant.

There are several smelting centers in the United States, such as Melrose and San Francisco, Cal.; Salt Lake, Utah; Omaha, Neb.; Denver, Leadville and Pueblo, Col.; Kansas City, Mo.; Baltimore, Md.; etc., and if proper efforts were made and due representations adduced in the right quarters, the result would undoubtedly be the establishment, at Hailey, the natural center of this region, of a smelting business second to none in the country.

This is what Wood River needs, and must have before long, to secure her continued prosperity.

MR. SINGISER ON THE MORMONS.

Hon. T. F. Singiser arrived in Washington last Monday, and will probably not return home until after the adjournment of Congress. In an interview with a reporter he stated that Idaho is rapidly increasing in wealth and population. The most perplexing problem at present in Idaho is that of Mormonism, three counties of the Territory being under their domination. Each year showed the evil increasing. The people of the East had no idea of the power of this section and from observation he felt sure that if needed they could muster 100,000 armed and fully-equipped fanatics eager to do battle for their faith.
