

THE BOARD OF EQUALIZATION.
Proceedings at Its October, 1887,
Session.

TUESDAY, OCTOBER 4.
The assessment of Geo. M. Parsons was reduced as follows: Upon furniture, \$300; upon certain mortgages, \$640.

Wm. Burke, W. W. Smith, the Armour Cattle Company, O. P. Johnson, A. W. Lockman, and others, praying for a reduction in the valuation of cattle for assessment, the Board denied the prayer of petitioners and ordered that the valuation stand as assessed, at \$17 per head.

The Board ordered that the assessment to Dan. McGinniss of mortgage recorded in Book F, page 106, for the sum of \$347, be stricken from the roll.

The Board ordered that the action of the Board on the 26th day of August last, in adding to the property valuation of the following named parties, be and is hereby rescinded:

Henry Shoddy, 350 head of cattle at \$17..... \$5,950
Pacific Land and Cattle Company, 1000 head..... 17,000
O. P. Johnson, 1500 head..... 25,500
A. W. Lockman, 500 head... 8,500
Daniel McGinniss, 400 head.. 6,800

The sworn application of Herbert Davis, for reduction of valuation of cattle as assessed to him, received, and after consideration denied.

In the matter of the application of N. C. Larsen for reduction of assessment, laid over from the August meeting, the Board ordered that the assessment on the improvements on lot 6, block E, city of Bellevue, be reduced \$600; on the mortgage of H. O. Brown to N. C. Larsen, reduced \$450, and that the action of the Board in raising the assessment of said N. C. Larsen on August 26, in the sum of \$500, be and the same is hereby rescinded.

In the matter of the sworn application of Mrs. Jessie McLean, for the reduction of the assessment of her husband, J. T. McLean, the Board ordered that the assessment on a certain mortgage made by N. J. Cumming to J. T. McLean, recorded in Book G, page 174, be reduced \$100, and upon the real estate in Broadford \$100.
