THE WORK OF THE DAIRY

ONE MAN'S METHOD OF MAKING CHEESES FOR PRIZES.

Dairyman J. H. Riley Furnishes The Rural New Yorker with His Formula. He Never Uses Any Color—Some Useful Information.

Here is one of The Rural New Yorker's prize cheese making processes, this time from Mr. J. H. Riley: The largest of my cheeses do not exceed forty pounds; the common ones mostly weigh thirty-five pounds, and the smallest are ten pounds. They are much liked by private families, hotels, etc. I have a steadily growing trade for this style. For shipping I put four or six in a strong, snugly fitting box, and I have received no complaints of breakage. This is a statement of my process:

Number of cows, ninety—natives and grade Jerseys. Feed, pasturage and fodder corn. The night's milk is aerated and put in a vat around which water is allowed to run during the night; after it has been put into the vat the milk is dipped and thoroughly stirred four times for ten minutes each time at intervals of fifteen minutes to further cool and aerate it, and prevent the cream from rising.

The morning's milk is aerated and added warm, and cream that has risen during the night is thoroughly incorporated with it. The temperature is raised to 86 degs. Four ounces of Van Hattlet's rennet extract are added, which renders cutting necessary in forty-five minutes. The curd is cut fine and the temperature is raised slowly for one hour until it has reached 90 degs., while the maker stirs carefully and continuously at intervals of five or ten minutes—temperature 99 degs. I draw the whey when the curd strings out to a length of a quarter to three-eighths of an inch when touched with a hot iron. The curd is then removed to a sink, stirred and cooled to a temperature of from 80 to 90 degs. It is salted at the rate of two and a half pounds to 1,000 pounds of milk, and put into the press where it is cooled to 64 degs. It remains in the press eight hours. I have never used any color.

Something New.

It is said that two extremely valuable articles of food are now prepared from skim milk by a new process. It has long been known that skim milk was a most useful food for fattening pigs. On the same principle, perhaps, it has been utilized as food for human beings in a form which is claimed to be highly healthful and nutritious.

The process used separates the solids of the skim milk from the water, and makes of them two food articles. The skim milk is heated and rennet mixed with it, which separates it into curds and whey. The curds are pressed and dried and cut into blocks. These blocks of curds are then mixed with bran or meal and form a most valuable food for cattle. They may be mixed with linseed meal or cottonseed meal.

Now for the whey. It is mixed with a like amount of skim milk. All the water is next evaporated from the mixture. A solid, cheesy substance remains. It is cut into blocks and roasted. This product is what is claimed to perform so important a part in human food. To the roasted substance is given the name lactoserine. The way to use it as food is to grind it and add it to coffee or cocoa in the proportion of a third or half. It makes coffee less stimulating and more nourishing and digestible.
