For goodness' sake, hire a hall!

"O. S. G.," the great constitutional expounder, occupies several columns of the latest Bellevue Herald with the usual ramble over, and about, and around his favorite topic. But he has toned down somewhat, as he now claims that only 13 sections of the State Constitution and four sections of the Constitution of the United States have been violated by the enactment of the Alta-Lincoln bills. A week ago, after reading his slush, we really believed that he claimed that every declaration of the Bill of Rights, every section of every constitution of every State or nation—nay, that every paragraph of the old English common law, the Napoleonic code, the laws of Justinian, the Caesarian or Roman code, and even of the laws of Lycurgus, of Draco, and of the Medes and Persians, had been violated.

### INFANT MARRIAGE IN INDIA.

The question of infant marriage reform in India is creating much discussion both there and in England. A petition bearing the names of over 2,000 Indian women has been sent to Queen Victoria, praying that the legal age for the consummation of marriage may be raised to fourteen years. A memorial written by Mrs. Mansell, M. D., and signed by all the lady doctors in India (fifty-five), makes the same plea.

with terrible "facts and considerations." It sets forth that Indian law at present "permits marriages to be consummated not only before the wife is physically qualified for the duties of maternity, but before she is able to perform the duties of the conjugal relation." The present system "produces sterility, becomes an excuse for introducing new child wives into the family," and thus creates and justifies polygamy. The system "tends to perpetuate itself and all its attendant evils to all future generations."

The indictment is complete and unimpeachable. But the memorial is especially impressive from the list of thirteen terrible "instances" mentioned, all of which have been met with in the ordinary medical practice of these ladies. Every one of these instances ought to be criminal, but the law cannot touch most of them. They include only cases of girls between ages of seven and twelve, and disclose the following results: Three immediate deaths, three instances of complete paralysis, and for the rest permanent maiming or frightful physical injury.

Strength was added to the agitation for reform by a recent occurrence in Calcutta. A Hindu, whose daughter had been married when she was a baby four months old, objected strenuously when the husband came to claim her at the age of ten years. The husband summoned the native police to his assistance, and the girl was borne away, shrieking for help while her father lay senseless on the threshold of his home. Nothing could be done, as the husband had the law on his side. On the following day the girl-bride died, a victim of the inhuman husband. This case has caused a thrill throughout India, and everywhere educated Hindus are joining in a demand for the repeal of the barbarous law which permits such outrages.

Hindu members of the Bombay Legislative Council, and about eighty other prominent Hindus of Bombay, Madras, and Poona, have presented a petition to the Viceroy begging His Excellency to raise the age of procreation from 10 to 12 years. They pledged themselves to influence their own families and friends to fix fourteen as the age. As a result the Indian government has made twelve years the legal age, but refuses to interfere further with existing laws. This does not prevent child marriage, even in infancy, but forbids the consummation of marriage before the age of twelve; giving girls under that age the same protection against their husbands as they have elsewhere against strangers.

### Do Foreign Manufacturers "Hug Themselves with Glee" Because of the New Tariff?

American Economist.

As an example of the many reasons which the English manufacturer has "to hug himself with glee" whenever the United States adds to the height of the tariff walls, we give below three short paragraphs from a recent report by Commercial Agent Smyth of Huddersfield, England:

Of the various industries affected by the new tariff, the steel trade is hit the hardest. From \$229,587 for the quarter ended June 30 it dropped to \$142,729 46 the following quarter, while in the next quarter, ended December 31, it shrank to a nominal showing of \$12,904 38. Here is a shrinkage of \$216,683 38 in the short space of six months, representing a decrease in this item alone of nearly 95 per cent.

The worsted trade, which in the June quarter footed up a total of \$745,648 80 dropped in the December quarter to \$428,616 87, being a decrease of over \$317,000, or nearly 43 per cent. The worsted values for the last quarter compared with those of the preceding show a falling off of over \$173,000, or nearly 30 per cent.

Woolens, which started off in the first quarter of the year with a gross value of \$77,592 70, jumped up to \$245,314 76 the next quarter, dropped to \$106,359 30 the following, and still lower in the quarter just closed, the gross value being \$93,114 29, a decrease of 60 per cent. as compared with the returns ending June 30.

It is not symptoms of total depravity which prompt us to glory in these misfortunes of British industry, but we know that our people will use just as much of these goods they ever did, and that they will be more largely supplied from American mills, thus furnishing work and happiness to our own people. We are simply reclaiming our own.

19th DAY OF JULY, 1891,

the public sale of the lots in the town-site of Pocatello, Idaho, will be begun at the door of the "Pocatello House" therein, and continued from day to day until all the lots and parcels in said town-site that are subject to sale at public outcry have been sold or offered for sale.

Pocatello is located in the Fort Hall Indian Reservation, at the junction of the Utah and Northern and Oregon Short Line Railways, and embraces in the aggregate 1840 acres. The Indian title to this land was extinguished, and the sale of the same in town lots authorized, by the act of Congress approved September 1, 1888 (25 Stat. at Large, 452), and so much thereof as was available for town-site purposes has been surveyed and platted into 602 blocks which are subdivided into 10,725 lots and parcels. The majority of these lots are 30 feet in width by a depth of 140 feet, and contain an area of 4200 square feet.

The sale will be conducted by the Register of the Blackfoot Land Office in Idaho, and all of said lots and parcels will be offered singly, to the highest bidder, for cash, except those lots purchased at private sale by the parties residing thereon at the date of the passage of the act above cited, but no bid of less than \$10 will be received for any lot or parcel; and the purchaser of any lot or parcel at the public sale, upon which valuable improvements had been placed prior to the date of approval of said act by a party who was then residing thereon, shall pay to such party a sum equal to the value of said improvements as determined by the appraisers appointed under the provisions of said act, such payment to be made and the receipt thereof acknowledged by the owner of the improvements, prior to the issuance of a certificate of purchase of the lot or parcel so occupied and improved. Full explanations will be made by the Register, prior to offering the several lots and parcels for sale, as to the exact location of each, the shape, size and area of the same, and whether there are any improvements thereon for which the purchaser of the lot will be required to pay.
