# INDIGNANT PROTESTS.

## IDAHO DEMOCRATS INCENSED BY TILLINGHAST'S ACTION.

They Refuse to Stand By It—A Murray Mass Meeting Declares Against the Weaver Elector Scheme, and Nominates Tried and True Democrats.

Spokane (Wash. Review.)

MURRAY, Idaho, Oct. 7.—[Special]

A mass meeting of the Democratic party was held at this place to-day to protest against the action of Chairman Tillinghast in placing on file the Weaver electors and not certifying to the Democratic electors. Dr. Ingalls was elected president and Frank Grierson secretary. Speeches were made by Hon. Frank Ganahl, W. W. Woods, Albert Hagan, James H. Hawley and Adam Aulbach. Judge Hagan offered the following resolutions, which were unanimously adopted:

Whereas, At a recent meeting of the Democratic State Central Committee the names of the Democratic electors of the State of Idaho were withdrawn from the ticket and the names of other persons not Democrats and who have never been nominated by any convention of the Democratic party were substituted for the Democratic electors; and

Whereas, The chairman of the Democratic State Central Committee has certified the names of such persons not Democrats to the Secretary of State as the Democratic electors; now, therefore, be it

Resolved, That we, as members of the Democratic party in Idaho, do protest against such usurpation of power on the part of the chairman of the Democratic Committee, and deny that he has any power or authority to certify or nominate any person as a Democratic elector unless such person is for Grover Cleveland for President.
