The Board of County Commissioners met pursuant to order of adjournment of yesterday; members present: L. F. Ramey and George Grubb; and the following proceedings were had and orders made:

IN THE MATTER OF FIXING THE SALARY OF THE PROSECUTING ATTORNEY.

The matter of fixing the annual salary of the Prosecuting Attorney for the term beginning on the second Monday in January 1917 came up for consideration, as provided by law, and it was ordered that the salary of such officer be and is hereby fixed at \$1200.00.

IN THE MATTER OF THE ORGANIZATION OF A RURAL HIGH SCHOOL DISTRICT OUT OF THE TERRITORY EMBRACED IN SCHOOL DISTRICTS NOS. 2, 3, and 29.

The petition of A. C. Waugh, et al., coming on to be heard, praying that school districts Nos. 2, 3, and 29 be united to form a rural high school district in said County, and that this Board make an order, calling for a special election of the qualified electors residing in said districts for the purpose of voting on the question of uniting said districts for said purpose; and the Board finding:

1. That there is not within the limits of said proposed rural high school district any incorporated city;

2. That the said districts are contiguous;

3. That the proposed center of the said rural high school district is at Leadore, and that the extreme distance from the said proposed center to the furthest point of settled land therein does not exceed the distance of ten miles;

4. That the said petition is signed by the head of a majority of the families residing in each of the said school districts, viz: Nos. 2, 3 and 29;

5. That the said petitioners are entitled to have such question submitted to a vote of the qualified electors at a special election called for that purpose;

NOW, THEREFORE, IT IS ORDERED: That a special election be held in said proposed rural high school district, consisting of school districts Nos. 2, 3 and 29 on Tuesday, the 1st day of August, 1916; that the question to be submitted at said election shall be "Shall School Districts Nos. 2, 3 and 29 be united to form a rural high school district and for the purpose of maintaining a rural high school therein."

That all qualified electors residing in either of said school districts may vote at such election; That each of said school districts shall vote separately in its own school house at said election; That the polls shall be open, at each of said school houses, between the hours of 9 o'clock in the forenoon and 5 o'clock in the afternoon of said day; That the polls in

each school districts shall be kept by one of the board of trustees of the district at the above prescribed place. That one judge and one clerk constitute the Board of Election for each said district; That any trustee or qualified elector of such district may administer the oath to said judge and clerk; That the ballots to be used at said election in each said school district shall have printed thereon: "For Rural High School—Yes," "For Rural High School—No," and that the several returns of said elections shall be certified by the board in each said school district to the Chairman of the board of county commissioners;

It is further ordered, that the action of this board cause three notices of said election to be posted in each said school districts, numbered 1, 2 and 29, one of which, in each district shall be upon the door of the school house therein for at least a day prior to the day and date of election.

IN THE MATTER OF A JOINT STATEMENT OF THE AUDITOR AND TAX COLLECTOR.

The joint statement of the Auditor and the Tax Collector was examined, approved and ordered filed.

IN THE MATTER OF THE REPORT OF THE GOOD ROADS COMMITTEE.

W. H. O'Brien, W. C. Shoup, C. G. Mathewson, the managing committee for good roads day, presented their report in detail, showing work accomplished on that day, to the Board after considering said report, expressed its appreciation of the splendid work done by the committee and the public generally, and ordered the report filed for reference;

IN THE MATTER OF A WIDOW'S PENSION FOR LILLIAN KEYS.

A decree of the Probate Court having been filed with the clerk of the Board, wherein it was ordered that Lillian Keys, be granted a widow's pension of \$10.00 per month, it was ordered by the board that the Auditor draw warrants monthly in favor of the said Lillian Keys for the sum of \$10.00.

Ordered that the Board do now adjourn until 10 o'clock A. M., Wednesday, July 12, 1916.
