FARMERS' SCHOOL AT IDAHO FALLS

Every person interested in farming is familiar with the old styled farmers' institute, and every one acquainted with this form of studying the problems arising in connection with up to date farming has recognized the defects of and the objections to the farmers' institute.

This year the Agricultural College of the State University at Moscow determined to put into operation in Idaho the plan that has remedied the defects and obviated the objection to this method of getting before the farmers better methods and solving local difficulties. This plan is the so-called farmers school.

Under this plan a session of two weeks is to take the place of the customary three days meeting of the past. During this time there will be daily, a forenoon, afternoon and evening program, consisting of lectures, problems connected with the farm and orchard, the dairy and the poultry yard. Under this plan there will be sufficient time given to each topic to go some what thoroughly into the subject and to allow of thorough discussion by the lecturer and those in attendance.

Owing to the fact that this plan has not before been tried in Idaho, the state college selected a few of the most convenient centers and will hold the sessions at these points. Idaho Falls is one of the five points in Idaho where this school will be held this year.

The Agricultural College of Utah is cooperating with that of Idaho in this plan and in this manner the two schools have been enabled to secure the best of talent in the way of lecturers and demonstrators for this course. A glance at the program will assure any one of the excellence of the working force.

Owing to the limited amount of funds available for farmers' institute work this year the colleges find it necessary to look to the local schools for some of the expense money for carrying on this work. With this in view the nominal fee of two dollars for the entire course of two weeks, twenty five cents for each full days' session and ten cents for a single forenoon, afternoon or evening session, will be charged, the funds so derived to be used in paying the expenses of the various lecturers and demonstrators who will have the work in charge.

Every effort is being made both by the local association of Idaho Falls and by the state college of Agriculture to make this course one of great benefit to the farmers who shall attend. The sessions will be held in the club of commerce rooms and demonstrations in stockjudging will be held in one of the ample stables near the center of the town.

BEETS FIVE DOLLARS PER TON

When wheat can be sold from \$1.50 to \$2.00 per hundred and oats the same; hay from \$6 to \$10 per ton and there is a big price for potatoes, and only \$4.50 per ton for beets I would not advise any friend of mine to grow sugar beets, although considering the advantage to the land and or advantages I would hesitate to say grow sugar beets. But now with grain at about 100 and the likelihood of it going still lower, hay a drag on the market at \$4.00 and \$5.00 and beets at \$5.00 it seems to me that but few farmers can afford not to go into beet raising.

In raising grain you never know what you will get and the same with hay. Beets you know just how much and when you get your money regardless of market. Beets make one of the best rotary crops, improving the quality of the land. There are several advantages in raising beets over raising potatoes. Potato prices are uncertain, sometimes, as in 1909, potatoes were unsaleable at any price. Late frost in the spring and early frosts in the fall greatly damage potato crops while doing but little injury to beets. When hard frosts come early as they some times do potatoes are made worthless or are greatly damaged, making a great deal of extra work sorting, etc. while beets are not damaged at all.

Having a sugar factory running to which your land is tributary greatly enhance the value of your land. Thousands of tons of hay are in connection with the pulp making the remainder more valuable. It gives a home market for butter, eggs, milk chickens, pork, etc., as the hundreds of employes must eat. It builds up the town to which you go to sell your produce and the larger such towns are the more desirable your farm is to live on or to sell if you should desire to sell.

You cannot expect to meet with success in raising beets unless you have the right kind of land. The field superintendent of the factory will tell you all about this. Any farmer should put in from 5 acres up with beets especially since beets are \$5.00 and I believe that in a short time the Blackfoot factory will have as
