## GOVERNMENT WATER FOR SALE

We are advised by B. E. Stetemyer, district counsel for the United States Reclamation Service that the Reclamation Commission has decided to allow the canal companies of the Upper Snake River Valley to purchase permanent storage water rights in the Jackson Lake Reservoir on favorable terms. There are several other sections where this water can be used if it is not taken by the canals of the Upper Snake River Valley so it will be necessary for each of the canals that have been cut on their water supply in the past years or which are short of water to make prompt application through the Farmers Protective Irrigation Association for the amount of Jackson Lake stored water desired. Said application must be in the hands of the secretary before April 20th, 1916.

In the application you must state definitely the number of acre feet desired or the number of inches wanted and the number of days you want to run this water during each season.

The association has been requested by the U. S. R. S., to furnish a list of all the canals who need stored water with a statement of the amount needed by each so that in case the Reclamation Service cannot furnish all the water applied for the amount which they can furnish may be pro rated to the canals that need stored water and apportioned to their needs.

The Reclamation Service desires that no canals which need water shall be left out or overlooked as one of the objects desired is to avoid litigation and trouble in running water in the future by providing for the needs of those canals which have been short of water in previous years.

We wish to call particular attention to the fact that it is a permanent water right that is to be sold and not just rented water for the year and that probably there will be no other chance to get stored water in the Jackson Lake as the Reclamation Service desires to use all water not bought at this time by the canals on other projects and no person or company will be obliged to buy water on this application unless the price and terms are satisfactory—but this information is needed at the present time so that the association can give the Reclamation Service the necessary information as to the amount of water to be needed by the canals of the Upper Snake River Valley and the names of the canals which wish to buy it. It has been suggested that a price of about \$3.00 per acre foot—payable in twenty equal annual installments without interest will be recommended by the local officers of the Reclamation Service but the price has not yet been decided upon. (An acre foot is equal to 25 inches for 24 hours)

As officers of the P. P. I. Association we earnestly urge that this matter be taken up by your canal as we believe this is the best opportunity at the present time for your canal to secure enough water for future needs.

We take this means of advising you that the older canals in the Valley will be unwilling to divide up their water with the canals of later dates in the future when the water runs short in the river and you will no doubt lose your crops and in order to avoid litigation and trouble in the future we earnestly ask that you buy this water at this time.

A meeting will be held at the Court House, Idaho Falls, Idaho, April 24th, 1916, at eleven o'clock a. m. for the purpose of discussing this and other water questions and all canal companies are asked to have representatives present.

### Man Who Wrote "Peck's Bad Boy" Dies.

George W. Peck, 75 years old, former governor of Wisconsin for two terms, and at one time mayor of Milwaukee, died in that city Sunday after a short illness.

Peck was one of three Democrats who since the admission of Wisconsin to the Union in 1849, held the position of governor. He was governor from 1890 to 1895. In 1892 his opponent on the Republican ticket was Former United States Senator John C. Spooner, whom he defeated.

Peck achieved national fame as a writer of humorous tales, his best known book being "Peck's Bad Boy." He was the publisher of "Peck's Sun."
