## WILL RESUME WORK ON BIG PROJECT

Work on the Big Lost River irrigation project, held up because of the objections raised to some of the specifications, especially those of the Mackay dam by Engineer Lippincott, may proceed immediately and the Utah Construction Company has been so notified. The men and machinery for the work have been awaiting word from Boise to go ahead. This was not possible until the land board acted. The board met yesterday afternoon, all members present except Governor Alexander, and on the suggestion of Edwin Snow, counsel for the Utah Construction Company, accepted the revised plans and specifications as presented under date of Sept. 27. Attorney General Peterson, acting as chairman of the board; State Auditor Huston and Miss Bernice McCoy, state superintendent of public instruction, voted to accept the plans. Secretary of State Barker voted against acceptance.

It was stated at the board meeting that the plans meet all of the objections raised by Engineer Lippincott. The citizens of Mackay laid the plans before this well known engineer and asked his criticism. He pointed out weaknesses in the manner of reconstructing the Mackay dam as proposed. It is understood that the board's action means that the famous Mackay dam can be built under the revised plans with the objections of Mr. Lippincott met, or in other words, the dam will be erected with little fear of it ever going out. The plans are said to take the foundation far below the river bed and to bedrock. The trouble with the former construction work was that the dam did not rest on bedrock and water passed under it. This structure has been the bone of contention for years, and has played no small part in Idaho politics. The land board some time ago accepted and entered into a contract with the Utah Construction Company to rebuild the irrigation project, but the objections raised held up the work.

## COST OF LIVING IS HIGHEST ON RECORD

Washington, Oct. 3.—A marked increase in the cost of living is shown in the rising tendency of the prices of foodstuffs on Oct. 1 reports which are being received at the department of agriculture. Flour is selling at the highest prices at any time since the civil war, principally because of the crop shortage. The cost of potatoes is mounting for the same reason. Meats and most farm products show a big increase in cost. Potatoes are selling at 116 per cent higher than a year ago.

## STOCK MARKET

Kansas City Stock Yards, Oct. 2.—Light receipts of cattle after Tuesday last week stopped the downward tendency of prices. Colorado stock steers selling at slightly higher prices Thursday. Today the supply is 35,000 cattle, strong on country grades. Shipments to country points of stockers and feeders last week amounted to 42,566 head, one of the big weeks at this market, though not a record. Offerings today contained about 90 cars of Colorado cattle, mostly Western.

## ORDINANCE NO. 195.

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF BLACKFOOT, IDAHO, GRANTING THE OREGON SHORT LINE RAILROAD COMPANY, ITS SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNS, A RIGHT AND FRANCHISE TO CONSTRUCT AND MAINTAIN A SPUR TRACK UPON AND ACROSS MAIN STREET IN THE CITY OF BLACKFOOT, IDAHO, AT A POINT DESIGNATED HEREIN FOR A PERIOD OF FIFTY (50) YEARS.

Be it ordained by the Mayor and Council of the City of Blackfoot, Idaho, Section 1. That there be and hereby is granted to the Oregon Short Line Railroad Company, a corporation, its successors and assigns the right to construct and maintain a spur track upon and across Main street in the City of Blackfoot, upon the following location, to-wit:

Beginning at a point in the north-westerly right of way boundary of the Oregon Short Line Railroad Company 100 feet perpendicularly distant from center line of main track of the Oregon Short Line Railroad Company at Engineers' Station 1292 plus 13.0; thence 71.3 feet northwesterly across Main street along the center line of a curve having a radius of 370.78 feet to a point in the northwesterly boundary of Main street, which is 139.0 feet northwesterly measured along the southeast line of block three (3) from the southeast corner of block three (3), Tanner's Addition.

Section 2. This franchise is granted upon the conditions that the spur track herein provided shall be laid in such manner as to conform to the present grade of the street and as not to obstruct the free passage of water in drains or other water ways, and if the grade of said street shall at any time be changed the grantee shall at its own expense alter the elevation and grade of said track so as to conform to such grade as shall be established.

Said track shall be so laid and maintained that the top of the rails shall conform as nearly as possible to the surface of said street and shall be paved or surfaced between the rails and for a distance of two (2) feet each side thereof with planks or wooden blocks, or other suitable material to be approved by the City Council, such pavement to be maintained at the expense of the grantee, its successors and assigns.

Section 3. Also upon the further condition that the grantee shall properly fill to the grade given by the City Engineer Main Street between the said Spur and the crossing laid on the north side of Jackson Street the surface of said fill to consist of crushed rock to a depth of eight (8) inches and to provide an easy, substantial approach on the north side of said spur with crushed rock or other suitable material subject to the approval of the City Council.

Section 4. The City of Blackfoot, Idaho, hereby reserves the right to open for public use any crossing it may desire on said spur track located on Main Street in said City of Blackfoot, and to grant a franchise to any transportation company to cross said spur track with its line or lines.

Section 5. That all cars crossing Main Street on this spur track must be attached to an engine while crossing said Main Street, and at all times must be spotted when standing so as not to block any part or portion of the streets or walks of the said City of Blackfoot, Idaho.

Section 6. Upon violation of any of the provisions of this ordinance on the part of the grantee, the City Council may by ordinance revoke and annul this franchise.

Section 7. This franchise shall continue and be in full force for a period of fifty (50) years from the date of passage and approval hereof.

Passed by the City Council the 3rd day of October, 1916, and approved by the Mayor the 3rd day of October, 1916.
