

#### Fish To Be Planted

Toronto, Ont.—Three hundred million young fish will be placed in the waters of Ontario during the coming spring, according to D. McDonald, deputy minister of game and fisheries. The young fry will chiefly consist of whitefish, salmon and speckled trout.

#### Marines Felt Bandits

Washington.—Action of the postoffice department in placing marine guards on mail trains and trucks has had the desired effect of preventing a number of carefully planned projects to rob the mails, according to reports to Second Assistant Postmaster General O'Shaughnessy, in charge of transportation. One case in particular, where a planned robbery came to naught, it was said, was in Texas, where preparations for a holdup were abandoned.

Believe Can Go Limit  
Washington—The supreme court decision in the case of Senator Newberry of Michigan makes it unnecessary for a candidate for the United States senate to file any expense settlement whatever in connection with either his nomination or election. Attorney General Daugherty ruled Thursday, in an informal opinion to Representative Luce of Massachusetts of the house subcommittee on elections. Under the ruling, candidates for the senate are given a free rein to spend as much money as they please without accounting so long as they remain within other requirements of the corrupt practices act.

Big Guns Cause Shakeup  
Los Angeles—Residents of the beach towns near here were jarred into a realization of the effectiveness of the dreadnoughts of the navy when the great war craft entered the stage of direct fire in the gunnery exercises off Catalina Island. Direct fire is a discharge of the guns by a control officer in the director towers of the dreadnoughts. The test for accuracy requires all guns of the dreadnoughts to be fired simultaneously from the director control. Falling windowpanes, plaster and broken glassware and china in homes twenty miles away testified that the big guns had some kick.

Prince of Wales in India  
Bombay, India—Coincident with a procession escorting the Prince of Wales through the city of Bombay Wednesday, serious disturbances occurred in the native quarter, attributed by the authorities to agitation by followers of Mahatma Gandhi, the Hindu "noncooperationist" leader, resulting in a number of casualties. The procession itself, however, was not marred by any untoward incident.

#### Motorman Flirts; Boy Killed

Denver, Colo.—A flirtatious motorman caused the death of William Russell, 10, according to Miss Esther Johnson, testifying at a coroner's inquest here. The boy was struck by a street-car and died a few minutes later. Miss Johnson, a passenger on the car, declared that T. N. Reed, motorman, was looking back at her when the boy was struck. She said the flirtation was not "mutual." The boy's death was "unavoidable," it was held.
