The polls at said election shall be open for the reception of ballots from 8:00 o'clock a. m. to 7:00 o'clock p. m. on said election date.

At such election the said qualified voters shall vote upon the question of the organization of said district and also for one person from each of said divisions for Director of said district, and the ballots for such election shall be in substantially the following form:

**BALLOT**  
ELECTION UPON QUESTION OF THE ORGANIZATION OF WEST SIDE IRRIGATION DISTRICT.  
(Instructions: If the voter desires to vote for the organization of the irrigation district, he shall place a cross (X) after the words "Irrigation District—Yes." If he desires to vote against the organization of the irrigation district, he shall place a cross (X) after the words "Irrigation District—No." And the voter shall also write the name of one person for each division, who is an elector and resident of such division of said proposed irrigation district, for Director

thereof.)
