

A ROMANTIC STORY.

Some years ago Randolph Georger, one of the well-known Virginia family of that name, came to this city in company with a quadroon woman, who had been a slave of his father's prior to the Emancipation Proclamation of President Lincoln.

George hired a house on South Passyunk avenue, and he and the quadroon lived together as man and wife. The fruit of their union was several children, some of whom were marvellous of beauty.

For years the pair seemed devoted to each other, but when the woman's beauty began to fade, Georges became indifferent to her. He afterwards began to drink heavily, and finally deserted her altogether, returned to his home in Richmond. Shortly after his arrival in the South, he fell heir to the property of his ancestors, the most valuable in the center of Richmond, near the ground on which have been erected the public buildings of the city.

He had not enjoyed his wealth long, however, when he fell a victim to disease and died suddenly, without making any legal disposition of his property. The woman, in the meantime, continued to live in Philadelphia with her children, and was forced to toil slavishly for their and her support. When, however, she learned of George's death, she immediately instituted legal proceedings in the Richmond courts as the widow of decedent, and claimed as her right a third of his estate, amounting to over half a million of dollars.

In support of her claim, she produced a certificate of marriage, purporting to have been executed by Alderman Mink, an ex-Alderman of this city, whose office was on Passyunk road, below Ellsworth street. The genuineness of this document was disputed by the family heirs of R. Georges, and Messrs. Richard Stokes, and William Briggs, former attaches of Mink's office, were summoned to Richmond, last week, to prove that no such marriage had ever taken place. The case is still on trial in the Richmond Court, and is being fought on both sides with great vigor.—(Philadelphia Times.)
