

A PLACER STRIKE AT CUSTER CITY.—Some of the richest placer deposits ever discovered in the Black Hills have recently been found about a mile and a half above Custer City, in what is called Last Chance Bar. The pay-streak, however, is of limited extent, being about 900 feet in length, with an average breadth of 150 feet, and the ground is all owned by one company—Peterson, Woodard & Modill; but there is promise of other equally important discoveries in the near future, prospecting enterprises being greatly stimulated in that locality by this discovery. Four men took out \$70 in a day wheeling their dirt for washing four hundred yards, with wheelbarrows, and our informant, Mr. Perry of Custer, tells us that the gravel seemed to prospect uniformly throughout. Water is obtained from French creek. The gold is coarse, nuggets being frequently found that weigh fifty cents. Peterson & Co. are making preliminary surveys with the view of getting water on the bar. Custer City may yet realize the rosy expectations of her founders as a mining center. There are veins in that vicinity of rich promise.—Black Hills Journal.


