We denounce the criminal suspension of the laws of Congress by the President, such as the purchasing power of the silver dollar.

We denounce the purchase and sale of the Electric Franchise as destructive of our liberties and treason to our Government.

We are justly proud of the public schools and State University of Nevada; we believe they should be fostered and protected above all other institutions.

We denounce the strongest terms the constitutional amendment to be submitted to the people of Nevada.

We are in favor of the further restriction of foreign immigration and the entire exclusion of paupers, criminals and contract labor.

We are in favor of an amendment to the Constitution of the United States providing for the election of United States Senators by direct vote of the people of their respective States.

We deny the right of authority of the Government of the United States to pass any law restricting or abridging the privilege of any citizen to the free coinage of silver.
