

SOUTHERN LINCOLN.

Another Good Word For The Semi-Tropical Section of Our County.

In his latest letter to the Salt Lake Tribune, Dan De Quille, writing in his usual instructive and entertaining style relates facts with regard to the southern part of our county, the truth and force of which are easily appreciated by all who have at any time of recent years, visited that section.

I have just received, through T. J. Osborne of Pioche, a box of pomegranates from the ranch of my old friend, Robert Logan of Muddy Valley, Lincoln county, Nevada. These pomegranates are more than twice as large as any I have ever seen from California.

Presently, as soon as they obtain railroad communication with the outside world, all these people will find themselves independently rich. In the valley of the Muddy, along the Rio Virgin and other streams, in fact, wherever water can be obtained with ease to irrigate, wonderful crops are grown, the products of temperate and semi-tropical regions being seen side by side.

Oranges, lemons, figs, olives and all other sorts of fruit, nuts, berries, etc., cultivated in California, here flourish to perfection. No finer grapes can be found anywhere than are grown in this region.

The rock of the region is limestone and limestone pebbles are mingled with soil rich the soil, which is of a reddish color. This soil is very strong and when irrigated proves astonishingly productive.

The mulberry flourishes finely and all the climatic conditions are perfect. The industry would give employment to ten times the number of people now in that country and so build up quite a home market.

A MUCH-NEEDED RAILROAD.

There is no better opening for a railroad anywhere in the United States than from Salt Lake City to Los Angeles through Southern Nevada. It would not only open up the rich semi-tropical valleys, but also other large valleys of cultivatable land at higher altitudes, great grazing ranges and immense areas of country rich in gold, silver, copper, lead and other metals and minerals.

Rich Gold Diggings.

Has anybody hereabouts heard of this? Near Death Valley in Tule Canyon, this State, some rich gold mines should be opened. In this canyon rich dry diggings were discovered some fifteen years ago. In 1880 a few men were at work there. They had no machines for dry washing, and did not even winnow the dirt by tossing it up in the wind—Mexican fashion. They simply dug over the ground with picks, collecting such pieces of gold as they happened to see.
