SILVER PARTY CONVENTION.

According to previous advertise-

ments, the Silver Party State Cen-

tral Committee met last Saturday at

Reno. It was decided to hold a State

Convention at Reno on Thursday,

September 8th. Primaries for the

election of delegates to this conven-

tion will be held on August 20th.

The various County Central com-

mittees are to district the counties

and arrange for the election of dele-

gates. Lincoln County was assigned 16

delegates. This is on a basis of one

delegate to every 50 votes, or frac-

tion thereof, cast at the last elec-

tion.

DeLamar's First Fire.

What may be called DeLamar's

first fire occurred at one o'clock on

Monday afternoon when the black-

smith shop of L. P. Christensen, sit-

uated on Mill St., directly in the

gutch, was destroyed.

The proprietor was around the

place, but when first discovered the

fire was well advanced and before

the general alarm sounded the

building was entirely enveloped in

flames.

Rosehouse No. 7 of the DeLamar

Co. was the nearest available water.

The town supply was shut off and

No. 7's hose run out. It proved

twenty feet short. Before addition-

al hose could be brought the burn-

ing building had fallen in and there

was great danger for a time that the

fire would spread to the adjoining

houses, through a series of tents

and destroy the entire upper part

of town.

Water buckets and dippers pre-

vented this and finally, with addi-

tional hose secured from the mill

premises, a good head of water was

turned on and the fire extinguished.

The building was about 25 feet

long with a small corral adjacent

for storing hay. The fire is sup-

posed to have started from sparks.

The Building and contents were en-

tirely destroyed.
