STATE PRISON GROWING.

Warden Considine institution now has within its stone walls a greater number of prisoners than before for many years.

When the present Warden took the place there were only 57 men confined therein for having run afoul of the commonwealth, but now there are 73, and within the next few weeks Mr. Considine is practically sure of about 20 more, or 93 in all, beside what may be picked up in the meantime.

Of the total number very few were every resident of Nevada, but are made up of professional crooks passing through, who stopped at Reno or elsewhere to do a turn and get caught. While this is a source of considerable gratification, it seems to indicate that were the official of other states as successfully in detecting and capturing the criminal as are those of Nevada, this state would be saved considerable expense in caring for criminals.
