## STATE NEWS.

### Items Gathered From Our Exchanges.

The Mason Valley apple crop was severely damaged in last week's frosty weather.

The Lyon County Times is to be enlarged to six pages and the plant equipped with a gasoline engine.

The Herald says Fallon is destined to become one of Nevada's garden cities with the completion of reclamation work.

The Bamberger mill at De Lamar, Lincoln county, is now running to its full capacity of 500 tons per day.

The Carson river overflowed its banks six miles north of Fallon last week, deluging the reclamation service office.

Clarence Mackay, of New York, has given \$50,000 to the University of Nevada.

The concrete foundation for the new State Library building at Carson is completed.

James P. Olding, of Carson, who has been attending the U. S. naval academy at Annapolis, will graduate June 9. He stands 64th out of a class of 125.

A number of Sale Lake City people who are interested in stock farming at Moapa, in the Muddy Valley country, will next year plant one of the largest asparagus beds in the world, according to Thomas Judd, of St. Thomas, who recently returned from a visit to that place. This year the company marketed sixteen acres of asparagus, and had in ready for the Salt Lake City market by February 20. It sold for as high as 20 cents a pound. Next year it is the intention of the company to plant 75 acres of asparagus, making one of the largest gardens of its kind in the world. —Salt Lake Telegram.

### Again in Circulation.

Uncle Sam has again put into circulation the \$2.50 gold piece, which for some time past has been practically obsolete. These shining gold pieces, which are a trifle larger and but a little heavier than the silver dime, are being handed over to depositors and others by the Bank of Sparks. "I thought you would kick on that \$2.50 gold piece," said Cashier Mulcahy at the Bank of Sparks to a customer today. Uncle Sam has again put them into circulation, and we will have to use them in cashing checks and making change except in instances where a kick is registered, on account of the size of the coin.

"Although I can count money as quick as the beat of them with the eagle half and quarter eagle I have to be more careful in counting sums, in which the \$2.50 gold piece is used. Most of the customers at the Bank of Sparks, who have received the \$2.50 gold pieces to date, have been glad to get hold of them, and kept them even when asked by Cashier Mulcahy if they preferred silver instead. —Forum.

A careful inquiry has been made which shows that over \$2,000,000 has already been paid by the insurance companies to the policy holders who suffered through the fire here. The small policy holders have been paid first and rapid progress is being made in the payment of all the smaller claims.

The larger claims will be slower of settlement owing to the fact that the policies exceeding \$50,000 have all been divided among different companies and these companies will have to adjust the losses between themselves before the claims can be paid. —Exchange.
