Items Gathered From Our Exchanges.

The pay rolls of the Bullfrog mines. The Republican State Central Committee will meet in Reno tomorrow.

Reuben Sabers with back rooms may be called upon to pay a heavy license.

Bullfrog and Rhyolite citizens are enjoying a temperature of 115 degrees in the shade.

A vigilance committee has been organized in Fairview on account of frequent robberies.

The trial of Walter Berican for the murder of Sheriff Logan in Nye county will begin in Tonopah July 9.

Blaine Gray, a Reno electrician, has been offered \$50,000 for mining property at Cherry Creek, White Pine county.

The Goldfield postoffice receipts have reached the sum of \$60,000 a year and it will probably be raised to the first class.

The Virginia Postoffice has a letter from Charles M. Schwab in which he tacitly announces his willingness to be a candidate to represent Nevada in the United States Senate.

A contract has been let to tap Eagle Lake in Lassen county, Cal., by running a tunnel, the water to be used for irrigating 120,000 acres of land in Honey Lake Valley.

The work of grading for the branch railroad from Walsworth to Olivine has commenced and the line will be completed within ninety days.

The Reno labor unions are preparing for a monster celebration on Labor day, the first Monday in September.

Work is to be resumed July 1st on the Comstock mines which were closed down on account of the San Francisco disaster.

C. S. Spurling has asked the Reno city council to pay him \$5,000 for his falling from the Truckee bridge on account of a safety rail breaking, resulting in fracturing his skull. He threatens suit if his request is ignored.

The Kimballs, who hold the contract for delivering the mail overland from Las Vegas to Bullfrog, a distance of 120 miles, have just been fined for taking it part of the way by rail and getting in 24 hours ahead of time.

They protested that they sent it a part of the way on the Las Vegas and Bullfrog Railway, now in process of construction, at the request of the people of Bullfrog who wanted their mail earlier, but the excuse was not accepted.

The fine stands and they will hereafter stage it the entire distance across the desert, and it will arrive 24 hours later than it can now be delivered.

The Department says it is paying for stage delivery and that the contract will have to be fully fulfilled no matter what the delay are.
