Drill for Oregon-Pioche

A new power drill for the Oregon-Pioche mine arrived this week, and will be installed in a few days. Development work is being pushed at this property, which is destined to become one of the leading mines of the Highland district.

Nevada's Metal Output

The mines of Nevada produced in 1907 gold, silver, copper, lead and zinc to a total value of \$17,591,486, according to a report by Charles G. Yale, just issued by the United State geological survey as part of an advance chapter from "Mineral Resources of the United States, Calendar Year 1907."

The yield of gold alone was 555,314.14 fine ounces, valued at \$12,099,455, and the value of the silver, at the average commercial price for the year, was \$4,675,178. The combined value of the gold and silver was \$16,774,633, an increase over that of 1906 of \$1,767,619. Less than \$1,000,000 of the state total came from the combined value of the copper lead and zinc.

Broadgauging Road.

The Southern Pacific Railroad company is broadgauging its line of road between Keeler and Mojave, California, and the grading has been completed to a point within ten miles of Keeler. This will give the Harriman system a short route to southern California. Trains for Los Angeles and other Southern Californian points will leave the main lone at Hazen.

Tomorrow is pay-day at the Prince Consolidated and several other mines in the camp.

George B. Royer, who is operating in the Bristol district, was called to his home in Salt Lake today in response to advices received of the serious illness of a member of his family.
