VALUATIONS FIXED

State Board of Assessors Concludes Annual Meeting at Carson City.

John F. Roeder, county assessor, has returned from Carson City, where he attended a meeting of the state board of assessors, which was in session for several days.

The board fixed the valuation per mile on railroads and livestock, as follows: Southern Pacific, main line, \$18,500; Nevada-California, broadgauge, \$25,000, side-tracks, \$3,500; Tonopah & Goldfield main line, reduced from \$14,000 to \$12,000 a mile, side-tracks, \$2,800; Nevada Northern, \$9,000 main line, and \$2,500 side-tracks; Salt Lake Route, a transcontinental line, \$9,000 for main line, and \$2,800 for side-tracks; Virginia & Truckee; \$3,250 main line, \$2,500 for side-tracks; Hazen and Fallon branch Southern Pacific, \$3,000 main line, and \$2,800 side-tracks; Tonopah & Tidewater, \$3,000 main line, \$2,200 side-tracks; Las Vegas & Tonopah, \$6,000 main line, \$2,200 side-tracks; Minden branch Virginia & Truckee, \$5,500 main line, \$1,000 side-tracks; Nevada-California-Oregon north of Reno, \$3,000 main line, \$1,000 side-tracks; Eureka & Palisade, left to the assessor of Eureka county; Nevada & California; narrowgauge, \$3,000 main line, \$1,000 side-tracks; Caliente & Pioche road, main line, \$3,000, side-tracks, \$800 a mile; Santa Fe, main line, \$3,000, side-tracks \$800; Western Pacific, left to the various assessors of the different counties; Silver Peak road, left to the assessor of Lander county; several small tram, ore and wood roads, left to the assessors in the various counties.

Beef cattle, \$25 per head; sheep, \$3 per head; buck sheep, \$5; stock cattle, \$15 per head in all counties except Esmeralda, White Pine and Lincoln, where \$13 was the price set; goats, \$5 per head; hogs, \$3 per head.

SCOTT AND PARTY VISIT BOSTON & POCHE
