SAVAGE-MILLER MURDER TRIAL

It is alleged, proved unsatisfactory to Cleve Carter, foreman, who was in charge of the property during the temporary absence of Superintendent E. R. Pembroke. He first discharged Miller from the employ of the company. Savage, who was a partner of Miller's then sought to mete out revenge, because Miller had been relieved, by first attempting to destroy property belonging to the company. When Foreman Carter heard of this, Savage also received his "walking papers." Harsh words passed between the two men, at the conclusion of which, Savage came over to town, obtained a gun and with Miller, returned to the mine, where Carter was mortally wounded by a bullet fired from the gun in the possession of Savage.

The jurors and witnesses have been summoned, the attorneys for the state and defense have outlined their plan of action and all is in readiness for the battle which is to determine whether the killing of Cleve Carter was justified or not.

The Record of next week will contain a full and complete report of the trial, as well as all other late news of the camp.

SILVER KING MINE.

Pat Sheahan Returns From Property With Fine Lot of Samples.

Pat Sheahan, the well known Salt Lake mining operator, arrived from the Utah capital early in the week and went out to the Nevada Silver King mine in the Silver King district, from which the Bristol smelter at one time drew on for a portion of its supply of ore, more than 2,000 tons having been brought over for reduction.

The Silver King is now owned by Mr. Sheahan, Thomas J. Osborne and others, and through the systematic plan of development undertaken there seems to be no question but what the property is going to develop into one of bonanza proportions. In the early days, as was the case in many other districts in those times, no attempt was made to do any systematic mining. The distance from reduction plants, and being without rail facilities, the owners were unable to realize a profit out of anything but the high grade ores; which being the case, the property was subjected to the "gouging" process without regard to the condition in which the mine was left.

Mr. Sheahan came in from the property night before last laden with a well filled sack containing a nice looking lot of samples of sulphides which was obtained from the Aleyone claim and in which six feet of ore has been exposed showing average values of 10 per cent lead, 25 ounces in silver and \$1.50 in gold. The vein proper is 20 feet wide, lying in a contact between lime and porphyry, while the entire mass contains commercial values. Adjacent to the Alceone, is the Vegas claim, where three feet of commercial ore has been exposed.

The Silver King property consists of nine claims in all upon which five shafts have been sunk, the deepest of which is a little over 100 feet.

CONTRACT AWARDED.

Pioche Firm Will School House For This Town.

The Pioche Supply & Construction company has been awarded the contract by the board of education to erect the school building which is to adorn the site selected for it just below town; the bid being \$9,000.

This contract, however, does not include the heating plant, or plumbing; as the latter is to be included in a separate contract.

The building is to be one story high and the material to be used reinforced concrete. There will be four class rooms, superintendent's office, cloak rooms, etc.

NEW TELEPHONE LINES.

Improvements Being Made By Utah Nevada & Idaho Company.

The Utah, Nevada & Idaho Telephone company has had a force of men here this week on construction work, under the personal direction of Superintendent H. Thomas. Mr. Thomas has taken up the matter of building a line to Oneota, with G. G. Davis, promoter of the irrigation enterprise out there.
