

LAS VEGAS MAN ABSCOND'S WITH WAD OF MONEY.

W. J. Oakford, who has been a familiar figure in the business of Vegas for sometime gathered together all the cash he could lay his hands on and left the country on horseback last Monday night, asys the Las Vegas Age.

Oakford was employed for sometime by the Las Vegas Mercantile company up to the time he, in company with his associates, purchased the meat market and continued the business under the name of the Vegas Packing company. Business with the new firm was very good, but trouble among themselves caused the withdrawal of Tony Schwegel from the Vegas Packing company, Schwegel going into business in a market of his own. At this time, June first, Morris South, formerly of Rhyolite, purchased a large interest in the com-

pany, Mr. South and Oakford being the active managers of the business.

Mr. South attended to the practical end of the business while Oakford, assisted by his wife, attended to collections, the deposit of money in the bank and the bookkeeping. No suspicion of any wrong doing on Oakford's part was never even suggested until Thursday morning last when he failed to appear at the shop as usual. Mr. South investigated the safe and found several things that surprised him. The money was all gone. The pages of the cash book showing the business of the company for the past month had been torn out and destroyed. Every book, paper or document relating to the company, including the shares of stock belonging to Mr. South which had been left in the safe, had been destroyed and the bank book missing.

The total amount of Oakford's embezzlement so far as can be ascertained up to the present date, is between \$2,500 and \$3,000. The greater part of the loss will fall to Mr. South. A warrant for Oakford's arrest has been issued.
